MEETING MINUTES

June 18, 2026, 3:00 p.m.

Call to Order

- Meeting called to order by Co-Chair Judge De La Garza.
- Quorum was established with representation from courts, DA, PD, Probation & Parole, and Commissioners.

Review and Approve Minutes

- Minutes from April 27, 2026, were unanimously approved.

Informational

I. Subcommittee Updates

Community Navigators

- Total clients contacted: 698.
- 358 accepted services, with only 12 returning to CCDC.
- 285 declined services.
- 28 were referred to another facility.
- 24 revoked services prior to engagement.

Deflection & Diversion

- Discussed the reimplementation of Project Redirect, a proposed pre-charge diversion program for low-level clients.
- Members expressed support for the program's potential to reduce system involvement and improve outcomes.
- Identified staffing, funding, assessment, and case management needs as key implementation considerations.
- Agreed to continue refining the program framework and exploring resource opportunities.

Corridor Crime Committee

- Reviewed public safety, system coordination, and diversion efforts within corridor areas.

- Approved the formation of a workgroup to review the current flow chart and Sequential Intercept Model (SIM).
- Workgroup will assess decision points, identify gaps, and strengthen diversion opportunities while maintaining public safety.
- Recommendations will be brought back to the committee for review.

Pretrial Services

- Reviewed ongoing efforts related to pretrial operations, data sharing, and release practices.
- Shared data with Criminal Justice Information (CJI) partners to support the NPRA revalidation process.
- Discussed prior coordination with North Las Vegas regarding administrative order compliance and release processes.
- A site visit in Henderson is planned to review local release practices and support regional consistency.

Domestic Violence

- Reviewed progress in strengthening collaboration and coordination among system partners.
- Discussed establishing a multidisciplinary domestic violence fatality review process in Clark County.
- Identified information-sharing barriers and explored technical assistance opportunities to support implementation.
- Discussed prevention and education efforts, including outreach to youth and community partners.
- Approved development of a client feedback survey to support service evaluation and continuous quality improvement.
- Established next steps focused on training, legal coordination, and ongoing prevention efforts.

DUI

- The subcommittee did not meet during the prior month.
- An overview of the Impaired Driving Solutions (IDS) Initiative will be presented at the June 25 meeting.
- Stakeholders are encouraged to participate to support a coordinated, system-wide approach to impaired driving.
- The initiative aims to strengthen collaboration, identify system gaps, and improve outcomes across the DUI continuum.

II. New Business Requests or Future Agenda Items

- Discussion about need for future presentations. It was requested that the Homeless Court that is currently being done in Municipal court present.
