The purpose of the above referenced project was:

The purpose of this project was to provide pre and post translocation monitoring of the desert tortoise in the Eldorado Valley.

The major accomplishment or findings of this project include:

The major accomplishments of this project:

- Three years of survey data was collected on four 5 km² plots. Eighty-eight tortoise were detected in the first year, 85 in year 2, and 102 in year three.
- Telemetered tortoise were tracked during the surveys with 12 tortoise being tracked the first year with an average of 36.5 observations a day, 15 tortoise the second year with 42.2 observations a day, and 15 tortoise the third year with 42.9 observations per day.
- During The first year of the study 56 tortoise received health assessments with 6 registering as positive for disease and 5 other suspected individuals.
