

Immunization Records

For vaccinations received in Nevada — **The Nevada WebIZ Public Access Portal allows parents and legal guardians to print official immunization records for their children through age 17. It also allows individuals 18 and older to print official immunization records for themselves.**

To download immunization records, visit the **Nevada WebIZ Public Access Portal** or call 1-775-684-5954. If you are unable to access records from the portal, you can submit a completed **Authorization to Disclose Patient Health information form** in **English** or **Spanish**.





Nevada Legislature Stay Engaged

The Legislature meets every other year and writes laws that may impact you. I like to say the Legislature writes policy regarding education, medication, and incarceration. Clark County has bills that may be important to you. Please feel free to let the legislature know how you feel through the [legislative opinion page](#).

- a. Ab 415 - This bill allows government to remove abandoned vehicles in the right of way and to dispose of them much quicker**
- b. Ab 211- This allows us to go after bad landlords and appoint someone to fix up the property**
- c. Ab 231 - Requires a service contract to impose certain duties on the provider of the service contract regarding Home Warranties**
- d. Ab 417- This requires a safety inspection on cars that are impounded because of trick driving.**

Get to know

CLARK COUNTY

Flamingo Road was originally called Monson Road, and only existed east of Las Vegas Boulevard, with a nearby street, Dunes Road connecting Las Vegas Boulevard with [Interstate 15](#). In the early 1980s, the [Nevada Department of Transportation](#) rebuilt the Dunes interchange at I-15, and constructed a six-lane Flamingo Road west to Rainbow Boulevard.

Tropicana Avenue was originally named Bond Road and changed in 1961.

[Hoover Dam](#), one of the greatest [engineering](#) feats of the 20th century, is located on the border between Clark County and Arizona. It provides water and [hydroelectric power](#) to the region.

Nevada has the right to consumptively use 300,000 acre-feet of water per year. An acre-foot is the amount of water that can cover an acre to a height of one foot and is equivalent to 325,851 gallons of water.

Sahara was originally named San Francisco Street. It was changed to reflect the Sahara Hotel around 1962.

[Paradise Palms](#) is the **first and only historic neighborhood in unincorporated Clark County**. It is located along [Desert Inn Road](#), between [Maryland Parkway](#) and [Eastern Avenue](#), and consists of 216 mid-twentieth century modern homes
