VIII. Public Comment

Robert Fyda with the Southern Nevada Health District invited the community to participate in a Citizen Advisory Board to address water quality and other topics. Marilyn encouraged the community to get involved as there are multiple wells in the area and this provides a way to allow the community to have input.

Marilyn shared that the community would have an opportunity soon to view the plans for the Sports Complex. The Sports Complex will include pickleball courts, baseball diamonds, a snack shack, an additional restroom, splash pad and Marilyn is also working on bringing in 1200ft of sewer lines. The Regional Flood Control will be engaging with the community soon to discuss a master plan update. Marilyn is still working on receiving the right-of-way on Liston and is currently working on other paving projects in the area such as the Airport Rd realignment. It will take approximately 6 months until there are dollars for paving. Marilyn will be working with the legislature to increase the maximum length of a trail to 3 miles rather than the current 1.99 mile maximum. She is currently working to realign the trail system and would like to establish a committee to begin working on this in the fall. The \$13 million flood control project will be coming soon near the Fairgrounds.

Marilyn is working with Utah and Colorado on infrastructure for water. There will be restrictions on pool sizes, will no longer allow evaporated cooling for new warehouses, and will not permit new golf courses.

There is approximately \$90 million in infrastructure coming to the valley.

Brian Burris thanked Marilyn for her involvement in the community and for bringing economic development to the valley.

Joe Davis - the water district is currently working with the Southern Nevada Health District, Resource Concepts, and Marilyn on their water protection plan regarding utilities restoring water. Currently the use is 400,000 gallons of water per day and the community is only recouping approximately 100,000 gallons. Joe is working on current policies which would require new development to receive input from local utilities in the northeast. Septic will be required to transfer to the wastewater system in the near future.

Marilyn announced that she's been working with Workforce Connections and Help of Southern Nevada to bring resources to the area. She is also working with Brian Sandoval to make MVHS a dual enrollment school which will allow students to earn college credits while they earn their high school diploma and is also working to bring an online automotive program to MVHS.

Sergeant Doty announced that he is holding a first Wednesday next week to give residents a chance to be engaged with our local police. They plan to meet once a quarter where they'll discuss various topics such as crime trends, OHV laws and other current issues within the community. The Northeast Area Command also plans to implement coffee with a cop as a follow up to first Wednesday.

Moapa Valley Budget Requests: finalized 10.13.21

Parks and Recreation

- 1. Finish ball fields & add play area for children. Add shade for bleachers with misters.
- 2. Clark County Fairgrounds Upgrades:
 - o Fix and cover Rodeo Arena bleachers & add walkway.

Description: Bleachers need to be brought to ADA standards including handicapped accessible seating. Lack of visibility is an issue because the bleachers are same height. The board would like the walkway to be lowered so avoid visibility issues when event goers are going to concessions and using the restroom.

- Extend the JR Livestock's existing awning heading into the area by approximately 6'.
- O Cover Existing Practice Arena with possible lighting Description: The board discussed looking at two possibilities- a brand new covered arena or covering the existing arena and requested a cost comparison from Horseman's Park. During the 7.10.19 MVTAB meeting Janice provided the cost for Horseman's Park COVER ONLY in the amount of \$4,777,000. The town board members discussed the possibility of a self-imposed tax which could be added to the ballot during an election cycle.
- 3. Commercial septic for Fairgrounds

Description: Clark County staff will work to identify a location; there are two possible sites: the east side of the Fairgrounds or at a site located off the main boulevard.

- 4. 4-H building enlarged (livestock building at the Fairgrounds)
- 5. Add splash pad to Logandale Park
- 6. New chairs with new storage racks for community center.
- 7. Add a separately designated pickle ball court to the Logandale Park.

Other

1. Shooting area with lights and maintained road (N. 200 acres of Heyer on the East side of Heyer)

Description: Board needs the County and BLM to designate the area of the shooting park so residents can legally shoot there. Shooting at night would be more convenient because of the desert heat.

NOTES: Brian Burris is interested into looking at possible funding from the NRA and Clark County

2. Construct a BMX track by Fire Station #73

Description: Would need a group, similar to the way little league runs the baseball games, to run the track. It would be a club ran by volunteers who would maintain the track.
