This past week we have continued to tirelessly work to bring our community the resources it needs during this difficult time. We have made significant strides in the past week, including adding 150-plus isolation beds for those who will need to be isolated due to COVID-19. In addition, the Southern Nevada Health District will have a 40-bed isolation facility, and the Cashman Isolation-Quarantine Complex (Cashman ISO-Q), which will provide around-the-clock care for hundreds of homeless individuals who need to be in isolation or quarantine, is expected to open soon.

We are also working closely with our federal, state, local, and private partners to secure much needed resources for Clark County, and on Sunday at 1:00 p.m. I will join Congressman Horsford to provide a COVID-19 update to the community. Eviction Relief for Nevadans


Nevada Attorney General Aaron D. Ford announced \$2 million in settlement funding for emergency rental assistance transferred to United Way of Southern Nevada and United Way of Northern Nevada and the Sierra. This funding will go directly to Nevada families in need of emergency assistance.

Social Distancing Expansion

Governor Sisolak issued new directives to increase social distancing in Nevada. All public sporting locations must close. This includes golf courses, pools, tennis courts and more. Open park spaces remain accessible.

He also directed businesses that use showrooms (car dealerships for example) must close. There are also new restrictions on open houses for realtors, no in-home hair services and stores can't have self-service where customers scoop the product.



Alcohol Delivery in Clark County


Clark County Department of Business License will temporarily allow package liquor stores to offer delivery service. Businesses will need to apply for a license that will go through the end of April.

The Cashman Isolation-Quarantine Complex (ISO-Q) is currently being assembled, which will provide around-the-clock care for hundreds of homeless individuals who need to be in isolation or quarantine, is expected to open soon. It is believed that the Cashman ISO-Q is the only one of its kind in the nation serving the homeless population.

U.S. Census

Since the kickoff of the 2020 U.S. Census on March 12, about 45.9% of households in Clark County have filled out their Census forms compared with 46.2% nationally, and 45.3% for the entire state of Nevada.

It's critical that we all complete the Census so that our community can get the funding and representation we deserve from D.C.

A link to the U.S. Census bureau's response map, which tracks participation rates by state in the U.S. Census is posted on the Southern Nevada Counts "Win the Census" campaign website at www.SouthernNevadaCounts.com. The Census form can be filled out online over the U.S. Census Bureau's website at www.2020Census.gov or by phone or mail.

The Census Bureau is operating toll-free language assistance lines in many languages including the three most common spoken in Southern Nevada: English **(844) 330-2020**; Spanish **(844) 468-2020**; and Tagalog **(844) 478-2020**.

Vote by Mail for June Primary Election



In an effort to limit the spread of the Coronavirus, the June 9, 2020, Primary Election will be conducted entirely by mail in Clark County and throughout Nevada. All Clark County active registered voters will receive a mail ballot packet from the County Election Department in the mail beginning in the **first week of May**. Because it is an all-mail ballot election, you will not be required to submit a mail ballot request for the Primary Election.
