Conceptual & Habitat Models of Six Covered and Three Evaluation Bird Species 2005-NPS-609A

The work for the above referenced project has been completed. Please see the attached for all project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

To provide habitat suitability models that predicts the occurrence of the targeted species across Clark County. This project is intended to identify critical components of suitable habitat of nine covered/evaluation bird species within Clark County — the southwestern willow flycatcher, blue grosbeak, phainopepla, summer tanager, vermillion flycatcher, Arizona Bell's vireo, Bendire's thrasher, Le Conte's thrasher, and gray vireo. The main efforts focus on developing predictive habitat suitability models and maps using environmental variables available in spatially explicit data layers. In addition, conceptual models have been developed depicting the relationship between each species, its habitat and stressors.

The major accomplishment or findings of this project include:

- Conceptual models, and spatially explicate habitat suitability models and maps were delivered for each of the nine bird species. The conceptual models used a 'traditional' approached to depict relationships between each species, its habitat, and potential stressors.
- The habitat suitability models (also known as species distribution models) and maps were generated using a maximum entropy approach in Maxent. Based on the conceptual models, available data layers were selected for modeling that best represented the important environmental features for each species.
