

Double Negative, a massive earthwork sculpture located on Mormon Mesa nitial creation and ongoing weathering, the composition of steel forms ech as the collapsing dynamics or erosion. Landforms and archaeology found same era of large earthwork creation evoke a distinctly American spirit of discovery. Subtle glyphs carved into the weathered steel forms honor the the rising explosive forces associated with large scale excavation as well Earth Rise is a work conceived in part as a gateway to Michael Heizer's approximately 8 miles northeast of this location. Inspired by that work's in the nearby landscape are recalled, and Space Age imagery from the Moapa Valley community that helped build Double Negative and has nosted art travelers from around the world for over 50 years.
