

Following the ceremony, visit the rotunda exhibit exploring the community's grief and healing process since Oct. 1, 2017. The retrospective is called "5 Years Later: Remembering 1 October & Becoming Vegas Stronger" and features letters, posters, signs, and other items from the Clark County Museum's 22,000-piece 1 October collection. Also learn about the ongoing work to build a permanent memorial that remembers those who perished in the attack, honors survivors, first responders and all those affected by the incident, and celebrates the resiliency of our community. The rotunda also contains the Angels of Love exhibit, which features glass angels in remembrance of the lives lost and the hundreds of people wounded as well as memorabilia to honor law enforcement and agencies that responded to the attack.



## Residential Pool Size Limit

### LVVWD adds residential pool size limits to service rules

As Lake Mead's water levels continue to fall, sectors across this community are being asked to further reduce water use to conserve precious water resources. While swimming pools offer a refreshing way to escape the summer heat, they also represent a large water use. Each square foot of a pool's surface area evaporates nearly 50 gallons over the course of the year. In Southern Nevada, nearly 2.5 billion gallons of water is lost to evaporation just from residential pools.

This summer, local city governments and municipalities are updating codes and ordinances to ensure single family residential swimming pools are not constructed in a way that waste precious resources. New pool construction at individual homes is now limited to a total

surface area of 600 square feet. This new cap on size will affect only a small number of residents who were planning to construct large pools as the average sized swimming pool in Southern Nevada has a surface area of 470 square feet – more than 100 square feet less than the new limitation. This action is estimated to save more than 3 million gallons of water each year.

This action is part of a series of conservation initiatives outlined in a previously approved Water Resource Plan and new community conservation goal. # Tier Two Water Shortage



As a result of shortage conditions on the Colorado River, the federal government announced a tier two water reduction in August 2022, limiting the amount of water Southern Nevada will be allowed to withdraw from Lake Mead beginning in January 2023.

Issued in accordance with the 2007 Colorado River Shortage Guidelines, the declaration reduces Southern Nevada's annual allocation of 300,000 acre-feet of water from Lake Mead—the source of 90 percent of the community's supply—by 25,000 acre-feet, or about 8.1 billion gallons. (An acre foot is equal to 325,851 gallons of water.)

# Vaccinations



Flu season typically begins in October and the Southern Nevada Health District and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend annual flu vaccine for people age 6 months and older. Once vaccinated, it takes about two weeks to develop protection from the vaccine. Flu can be a serious illness for people who are at higher risk for complications, such as young children, people with chronic medical conditions, and older adults. A flu shot is the best protection against flu and its complications. Vaccine will be available at pharmacies, clinics, and the Southern Nevada Health District.





For individuals 50 and over, there is a second booster shot available.

Additionally, adults in Clark County now have another COVID-19 vaccine available to them at Southern Nevada Health District clinics. Novavax, which has been used worldwide, is currently available at the Health District's COVID-19 clinic at 280 S. 



## PENFRIENDS
