NOTICE OF ROAD CONSTRUCTION

INTERSTATE 215 AND AIRPORT CONNECTOR INTERCHANGE PHASE 3

Clark County Department of Public Works (CCPW) is reaching out to inform you of upcoming construction activity on the Interstate 215 and Airport Connector Interchange Phase 3 project.

This 2-year-long, \$49.5 million project will generally consist of widening roadway segments, lane realignment, pavement rehabilitation, a bridge structure, retaining walls, ramp reconfiguration and new ramp construction, medians, sidewalks, signing/striping/lighting, ITS, and landscape/aesthetics, and other related items of work.

Please drive safely in the work zone areas and be advised of the following:

- Some lanes will be restricted, reduced, or closed at various times for the duration of the project.
- Message boards will be placed in advance of traffic control changes.
- Local traffic is encouraged to use alternate routes whenever possible.
- Working hours are subject to change. Night work may occur at various times during the project.
- Additional notices will be distributed to your specific address 72 hours prior to construction activity impacts near residents or business.
- The contractor will ensure that driveway access within traffic control setups will be maintained. The contractor will coordinate with properties whose driveways will be directly affected.
