Chair Tim Watkins has not been able to conclude whether he can support a cultivation site in the Moapa Township, so voted nay in opposition of the potential cultivation project. The remaining, present, board members are in support of a cultivation site being in Moapa but did not like the idea of it being located near the cemetery. They suggested looking into sites located on Hidden Valley or Meadow Valley. Just Quality will look into possible site locations and will return to the board at a later date. A resident expressed concerns whether the LDS church supports THC, and asked why they hadn't chosen Pahrump. Jay Matos explained that their license does not allow them to move jurisdictions; their license only applies within Clark County. Just Quality is a discreet business in the sense that they do not market their cultivation site so this mean no signs, buildings, billboards or windows. There were also some questions related to shifts. There will most likely be 2 twelve hour shifts that will include both part time and full time employees. It will take up to 1 year before they'd be up and running on the full 10 acre parcel, so they would hire in phases accordingly. This would include employees in security, administration, compliance, cultivation etc. Just Quality is committed to being a good partner and will look for a location which better suits the community.

Bob asked what occurred during the NDOT meeting whether or not Janice had mentioned his request. Yes, but they were not prepared to address questions at that time. Instead, NDOT thought it'd be better suited to come back for a workshop and bring personnel who are versed in various departments which would better address community concerns.

VII. General Business

The board discussed the budget items and will combine numbers 4 & 7 which will now become number 1 under Parks. John Stastny, Parks and Rec, discussed adding more lighting to the southeast parking lot. Under Public Works the board would like item number 1 to read "Repave and Re-engineer Sim".

John Stastny discussed that the fenced Ron Lewis play area project is 60% complete

VIII. Public Comment

3125 Hillside Dr. Grace Perkins - is looking for an update on the marijuana cultivation development that's being proposed. Grace is not opposed to them being located at 3335 Hillside and likes the idea of requesting that the developer potentially paving the road leading to the cemetery. Tim Watkins- Tim and John Wray met with the developer (Ikänik Farms, Inc.) vesterday who was able to provide helpful information as to how their operation would function including details regarding the amount of employees the facility will have which is approximately 40 with two shift changes. Ikänik Farms, Inc. is interested in meeting with the residents of Moapa to help provide clarity regarding the proposed cultivation facility; they anticipate meeting late August or early September. Tim encouraged Grace to speak with her neighbors and encourages everyone to attend. The developer is specifically looking at Moapa because their license is designated for unincorporated Clark County locations and the location on Hillside is ideal for security and financial reasons due to the topography and existing utilities. Once a date has been chosen fliers will be distributed. Tim is in the process of reaching out to the Mayor of a like location in California. Tim asked for an update on the erosion of Henrie Road. Public Works was able to repair some of the damage but there's still existing repairs needed. Amelia will follow up for an update. The I-15 Southbound off ramp remains an area of concern (Exit 91). Tim-Travelers seems to drive through the stop sign which has caused many close calls for those exiting the ramp. Metro is aware of the issues involving this exit ramp. Janice- Amelia is working with NDOT to have them meet with our residents to address concerns and requests. There seems to be confusion where to enter or exit for both Northbound and Southbound travelers. Amelia will also work to provide an update on Terrible Herbst. John Stastny explained that the baseball fields are at full capacity during the month of March when Utah students are on Spring Break after he was asked about the budget item that speaks to additional baseball fields.






