Project Description

General Summary

Site Plans & Request

The plans depict an existing site with 9 different buildings that are individually located on 9 contiguous parcels. The 8 buildings provide interior access to each other, giving the appearance of 1 large building, with a central building connecting the other 8 structures together and providing interior access to the individual buildings. Access to the site is granted via Sammy Davis Jr. Drive, Fashion Show Drive, Las Vegas Boulevard South, Fashion Lane, and Mel Torme Way. The proposed vehicle rental facility will be located within the interior of the shopping center building in an atrium area located in the central building. The vehicle rental facility is on the ground floor of the shopping center with escalator connections to the lower-level parking garage where the rental vehicle fleet will be located directly under the rental desk area. The current parking requirement for the Fashion Show Mall is 4,830 spaces with 5,543 being provided after the 20 proposed rental vehicle spaces are deducted from the overall count.

Landscaping

No additional landscaping is proposed or required with this request.

Floor Plans

The floor plans show the vehicle rental facility will consist of a 313 square foot open air lease area within the western atrium of the central mall building. The lease area will be located under an existing escalator bank with 2 desk structures located at the eastern edge of the lease area. The desks themselves will be 6.45 square feet each and located in front of a 7.8-foot-tall cabinet and storage structure with company branding. The remaining portion of the lease area will be dedicated to a customer queuing and waiting area.

Applicant's Justification

The applicant will add a car rental desk as an accessory use to the existing Fashion Show Mall, providing visitors with an additional amenity. The proposed use represents a valid use at this property. The desk will be open 7 days a week and will be staffed by a branch manager and two rental agents. Customers will receive their rental agreement and car keys at the Sixt desk inside the mall and then proceed down to the parking garage where 20 parking stalls will be dedicated to the rental vehicle fleet, which represent a minor number of spaces.

Use Permit

A special use permit is considered on a case-by-case basis in consideration of the standards for approval. Additionally, the use shall not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent properties, character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare; and will be adequately served by public improvements, facilities, and services, and will not impose an undue burden.

The proposed vehicle rental facility, including both the fleet parking and desk area, will be entirely contained within the interior of the Fashion Show Mall building and will not be visible from the street. The proposed structures are essentially moveable desk areas that should not have an impact on the design or floor layout of the building. The existing shopping center is relatively large and already experiences a high amount of car and pedestrian traffic, so the potential increase in both car and pedestrian traffic to access the proposed vehicle facility should be negligible on both the site and the surrounding neighborhood. Additionally, the site will remain well parked even after the fleet spaces are deducted from the overall provided parking space total, so the use of any existing spaces for the 20 fleet vehicles should not be an issue. The use of the site for a vehicle rental facility is both compatible and complementary as the existing shopping center is along the Las Vegas Boulevard South corridor and the proposed site would

allow for both residents and visitors to have convenient access to a rental car. Finally, staff finds the proposed vehicle rental facility would support Master Plan Policies 5.1.3 and 5.1.5 which support the adaptive reuse of existing shopping centers particularly for uses that support the existing economic bases, such as tourism, of the Las Vegas Valley. For these reasons, staff can support this request.

History & Site Plan

The subject building was constructed in 2002 and originally occupied by the Lili Clair Vocational Training Center Foundation, which was a minor school approved via UC-0132-01. A use permit for an office with a waiver for reduced parking was approved in April 2014 via UC-0065-14. However, the Notice of Final Action included a condition for the application to be reviewed as a public hearing 1 year after approval to ensure the parking reduction did not adversely affect adjacent properties. The review was never completed, which led to the expiration of the use permit and waiver. The applicant is now requesting reapproval of the use

permit for an office and a waiver for reduced parking. There are no proposed changes to the site associated with this application.

The plans depict an existing 3,758 square foot office building that has vehicular access via an alley east of the site. The building is set back 9 feet from the north property line, 24 feet from the east property line, 22 feet from the south property line, and 6 feet from the west property line. Typically, 9 parking spaces would be required based on the gross floor area of the building. However, the site is located approximately 350 feet from a fixed transit stop to the west, which allows parking to be reduced by 10%. The 6 parking spaces are located on the east side of the building, where 8 parking spaces are required, necessitating a waiver of development standards. A pedestrian gate is located on the southeast side of the building, adjacent to the parking area, with a walkway that leads from the parking area and continues around the building. The trash enclosure is located in the northeast corner of the site.

Landscaping

The photos provided depict existing landscaping along the south and east sides of the site, consisting of trees and shrubs. There are no proposed changes to landscaping associated with this application.

Elevations

The photos provided depict an existing 21 foot high building constructed with stucco and featuring grey, black, and beige coloration. The entrance is on the south side of the building. The roofline is flat and variable.

Floor Plans

The plans depict a 3/158 square foot office building featuring several office rooms, a conference room, a great room, storage rooms, restrooms, a kitchen, a lobby, and reception room.

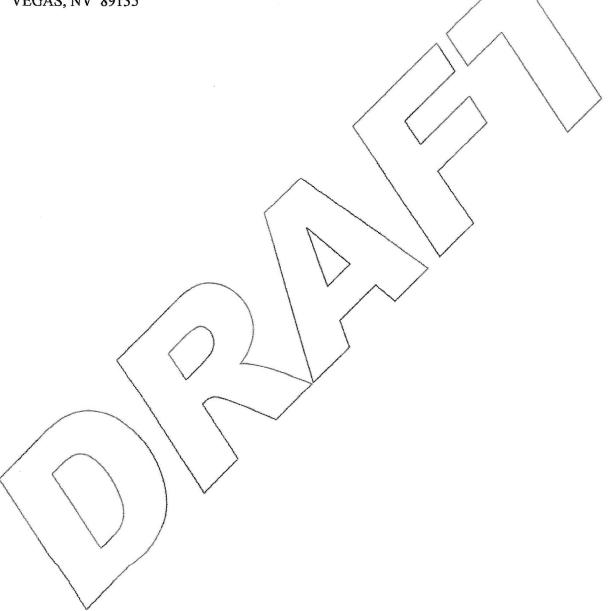

This project was originally approved on October 3, 2023 by the Planning Commission with a condition to review as a public hearing in one year. The approved plans show an existing vehicle

repair facility. The applicant requested to build an attached addition that would be 2,567 square feet. The first extension was approved on November 19, 2024 by the Planning Commission (ET-24-400109). While completing the building permit, the applicant found out that there was an existing leach field underneath the proposed addition that cannot be built upon. As a result, revised plans were submitted that showed a 1,419 square feet detached building, rather than the original attached design, located on the south portion of the property. ADR-25-900592 was approved by the zoning administrator in July 2025 for that change. Now the applicant is applying for their second extension of time to complete their building permit.

Site Plan

The approved plans depict an existing vehicle repair facility within a 2,432 square foot building built in 1983. The existing building is located along the west side of the site. The originally approved plan showed an attached addition to an existing vehicle repair facility. The addition was 2,567 square feet. The revised plans approved with ADR-25-900592 show that the proposed addition will be detached and 1,419 square feet in area. The proposed detached metal building is located along the south side of the property. Access to the site is via a private cul-de-sac, Cannoli Circle. Originally, the applicant requested a waiver to reduce parking. However, the revised plans approved with ADR-25-900592 show 13 parking spaces are provided for this facility where only 8 parking spaces are required. Therefore, the waiver to reduce parking is no longer needed. The trash enclosure is located on the northeast corner of the site, intruding into the right-of-way setback along Cannoli Circle by 1 foot 2 inches, therefore, waivers of development standards were included in the original application. Additionally, a design review for the addition, as well as a use permit to allow service bay doors facing a street (Cannoli Circle) are a part of the original request. The hours of operation are Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The vehicles being repaired are automobiles and light trucks and will not include any watercraft or recreational vehicles.

Landscaping

The approved plans show existing 6 foot wide street landscaping (palm trees) along Wynn Road. According to the applicant, the landscaping has been there for at least 20 years. No parking lot landscaping is proposed on site.

Elevations

The originally approved plan shows an existing 1 story plaster over CMU 2,432 square foot building. The revised plans approved with ADR-25-900592 show a proposed 1 story addition is a 1,419 square foot metal building, which will be detached from the existing building. The height of the new building will be 18 feet. The proposed metal building will be painted to match the existing CMU building. The overall height of the existing vehicle repair facility is 18 feet.

Supporting land uses include accessory dwelling units and neighborhood serving public facilities, such as parks, trails, open space, places of assembly, schools, libraries, and other complementary uses.

Staff can support the proposed request. The request will allow for an unused portion of the flood channel to be incorporated with the approved single-family residential subdivision to the east. Eliminating the void between the approved subdivision and the physical flood channel will improve safety in the area and eliminate an area for trash to gather or people to loiter. Furthermore, with the area being transferred over to private use as part of the approved subdivision, the land use category of Public Use (PU) is no longer appropriate. The proposed Mid-Intensity Suburban Neighborhood (MN) land use category will match the existing land use category of the adjacent approved subdivision to the east. For these reasons, staff finds the request for the Mid-Intensity Suburban Neighborhood (MN) land use category is appropriate for this location.

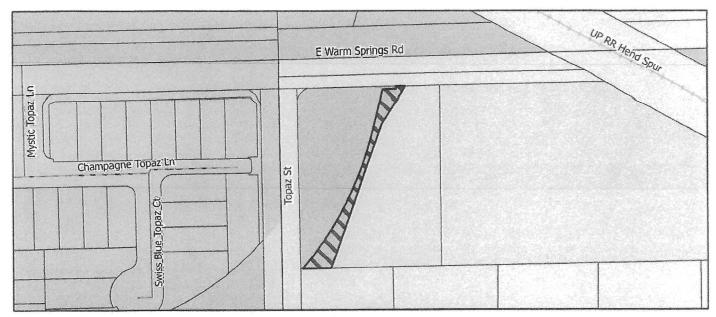

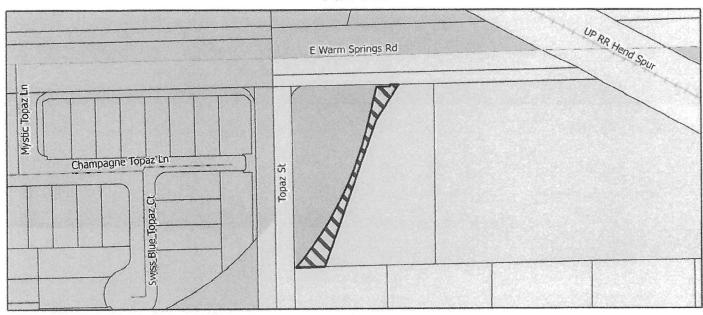

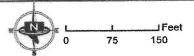

To Whom It May Concern:

Ali Kaveh respectfully submits this justification letter in support of a zone change from RM-50 (Multifamily Residential) to CG (Commercial General) for approximately 9.44 acres located near the intersection of Spring Mountain Road and Wynn Road.

Introduction and Purpose

The purpose of this application is to align the subject site's zoning with the predominantly commercial character of the Spring Mountain corridor. Rezoning to CG will enable a cultural, pedestrian-friendly retail and dining hub that serves nearby neighborhoods and the broader Las Vegas Valley, reinforcing the corridor's role as one of the city's most important commercial and cultural destinations.

Justification for Zone Change

1) Consistency with Surrounding Land Uses

Spring Mountain Road functions as a major commercial corridor defined by continuous shopping centers, restaurants, entertainment, and service businesses. The subject site is directly surrounded by other commercial and mixed-use properties, making the RM-50 designation inconsistent with actual corridor development patterns. Rezoning to CG will create land-use consistency and continuity within the district.

2) Compatibility and Appropriate Transitions

The proposed use will integrate landscape buffering, pedestrian pathways, and streetscape enhancements to ensure smooth transitions to adjacent uses. The project will complement, not compete with, surrounding properties—adding neighborhood-oriented retail, dining, and service options within easy walking distance.

3) Economic and Cultural Contribution

This zone change allows for the creation of a modern cultural retail hub that:

- · Generates new employment opportunities during construction and long-term operation;
- Produces sales tax revenue to support County infrastructure and services;
- Prioritizes local and culturally relevant tenants reflecting the corridor's unique identity;
- Enhances walkability and reduces reliance on auto-oriented development.

4) Conformance with County Goals and Policies

The CG designation supports Clark County's policy objectives of intensifying appropriate commercial uses along major arterials and fostering economically vibrant, community-serving centers. The proposed change creates a cohesive land-use framework that better serves local residents and reflects real market demand.

Conclusion

The requested zone change from RM-50 to CG is consistent, compatible, and community-focused. Analysis

Comprehensive Planning

In addition to the standards for approval, the applicant must demonstrate the zoning district is compatible with the surrounding area. The request for RS3.3 zoning is compatible with the surrounding area. The request will allow for an unused portion of the flood channel to be incorporated with the approved single-family residential subdivision to the east. Eliminating the void between the approved subdivision and the physical flood channel will improve safety in the area and eliminate an area for trash to gather or people to loiter. Furthermore, the proposed RS3.3 zoning will match the existing RS3.3 zoning of the adjacent approved subdivision to the east. For these reasons, staff finds the request for RS3.3 zoning is appropriate for this location.

A 6 foot high, solid, and non-decorative fence disrupts the harmonic elements of the community and detracts from the code requirements; therefore, staff cannot support this request.

As the owners of 3095 E. Viking Rd, we recently had our RV burglarized on 2/7/2025 while parked in our driveway. The financial impact was well beyond \$20,000. Extensive damage to the vehicle in the amount of \$8,800 had to be repaired. In addition over \$12,000 of items were stolen from the vehicle. A police report was completed at the time, a copy of this police report, with Case Report No: LLV2502000026852 is available upon request.

Since this incident, we have installed a privacy fence to the perimeter, which includes the front perimeter of the lot. This fence is exactly 6 ft tall, and is a non-decorative fence. The fence is solid without any gaps, and is a proactive effort to mitigate future security risks by creating a solid barrier that deters potential intruders and enhances privacy.

We are requesting for a waiver to development standard for two reasons. The first reason is for privacy and security. The recent burglary incident underscores a heightened need for enhanced security measures to protect personal property and ensure our safety. The second reason we are requesting a waiver, is because this type of fence already exists in our neighborhood. The existing fence on our neighbors property at 3065 E. Viking Rd is constructed of solid cement, without any gaps. This precedent set by the neighboring property at 3065 E. Viking Rd, identified by parcel number APN 162-13-801-002, significantly strengthens our argument for granting the requested waiver. The fact that this neighboring



property has already been granted a waiver for a solid privacy fence establishes a clear pattern of accommodating similar requests within the neighborhood. We truly appreciate your time and hope that you will consider approving this waiver for our safety and privacy.

The new hotel tower and buildings will consist of 1,208,301 square feet of total area.

Via WS-23-0593 the following structures were removed per the previously approved plans: the existing animal exhibit and habitat, some existing pool structures which include 16 cabanas, a pool bar, lanais, and existing back of house areas (non-public spaces). The total building square footage to be removed is expected to be 172,938 square feet. Furthermore, the plans submitted under WS-23-0593 focused on areas along the south property line and the valet drop-off area in between the self-parking garage and the valet garage (north porte-cochere).

Furthermore, the approved plans depict a reduced driveway throat depth to 27 feet where 150 feet is required per Uniform Standard Drawing 222.1. This geometric driveway exists and is adjacent to Sammy Davis Jr. Drive. The existing attached adewalk and landscaping along Sammy Davis Jr. Drive will remain, hence the approved deviation.

Landscaping

The previously approved and cape plan focused on the southwest corner of the site. Plant types listed on the plans comply with the Southern Nevada Water Authority Plant List. The landscaping primarily faces interior to the site adjacent to the pool areas, also within the private drive aisle adjacent to the existing villas (north side). History and Request

The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) previously approved a use permit in June 2021 to allow a place of worship via UC-21-0184. The waiver of development standards and the design review were denied with that application. The first extension of time for the place of worship, ET-23-400094 (UC-21-0184), was approved by the BCC in August 2023. The applicant subsequently submitted WS-23-0544, an application for waivers of development standards and a design review for a place of worship that was approved by the BCC in October 2023. The previously approved requests, UC-21-0184 and WS-23-0544, have not commenced. Therefore, a second extension of time is now being requested to commence the place of worship.

Site Plan

Per WS-23-0544, the approved plans depict an existing 1 story single-family residence that is being utilized as a place of worship. The place of worship is set back 215 feet from the west property line along Spencer Street, 12 feet from the north property line, 15 feet from the south property line, and 48 feet from the east property line. The place of worship is located within the eastern portion of the project site. An existing carport is located 9 feet to the west of the building, with a setback of zero feet along the south property line, which is being removed to allow for a drive aisle to the rear of the property for additional parking. A proposed trash enclosure is located to the northwest of the place of worship, with a setback of zero feet from the north property line requiring a waiver of development standards. Two existing storage buildings, each measuring 48 square feet, are located on the northeastern portion of the site with a 3 foot setback from the rear and side yards, and a minimum separation of 6 feet between structures. An existing pool is located within the rear yard of the project site; however, the pool appears to be empty based on recent aerial photographs. The place of worship is required to have 37 parking spaces, and 37 parking spaces are depicted on the plans, with 34 parking spaces located to the west of the building and 3 parking spaces located on the southeastern corner of the site. Six parking spaces are designed as parallel with a minimum length of 21 feet and width of 9 feet, meeting Code standards. The on-site circulation of vehicles is serviced by a one-way circular drive aisle, ranging between 10 feet to 18 feet in width. Bicycle spaces are located at the northwest corner of the building. Access to the site is granted via a single, existing 20 foot driveway along Spencer Street, requiring a waiver to reduce the required width of the driveway. An existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalk is located along Spencer, Street.

Landscaping

Per WS-23-0544, the approved plans show an existing attached sidewalk along Spencer Street will remain and no street landscaping is proposed along the right-of-way, which required a waiver of development standards. The interior of the parking lot features a central landscape area with 11 existing palm trees, 8 of which will be removed to accommodate the drive aisle width and parking adjacent to the place of worship. Per the Development Code, palm trees are not allowed in the interior of parking lots as they provide minimal shade; therefore, a waiver is necessary to eliminate parking ot landscaping. Five existing palm trees are provided along a portion of the southwest property line, adjacent to a single-family residence, which will be removed to allow for parking along the south property line. The plan depicts 4 existing palm trees along a portion of the northwest property line, adjacent to the drainage channel. No other perimeter landscaping is provided along the northeast, east, and southeast property lines of the project site, which are adjacent to single-family residences. Waivers are being requested to eliminate landscaping adjacent to the existing residential uses. An existing 6 foot high CMU block wall surrounds the perimeter of the project site.

Elevations

Per WS-23-0544, the approved plans depict an existing place of worship consisting of a stucco exterior and an asphalt shingled roof. The height of the existing building is 20 feet to the top of the pitched roof and 23 feet to the top of the cross. The exterior of the building is painted with neutral, earth tone colors. The height of the existing metal carport is 8 feet. The existing storage buildings are 7.5 feet in height. The storage buildings consist of an asphalt shingled roof with exterior wood siding. The storage buildings are painted with neutral earth tone colors.

Floor Plans

Per WS-23-0544, the approved plans show a 3,653 square foot place of worship consisting of a front and main sanctuary area, prayer room, media room, restroom facilities, children's room, kitchen, mass hall, storage and equipment rooms, and pantry.

The approved plan depicts an existing 1 story single-family residence that is being utilized as a place of worship. The place of worship is set back 215 feet from the west property line along Spencer Street, 12 feet from the north property line, 15 feet from the south property line, and 48 feet from the east property line. The place of worship is located within the eastern portion of the project site. An existing carport is located 9 feet to the west of the building, with a setback of zero feet along the south property line, which is being removed to allow for a drive aisle to the rear of the property for additional parking. A proposed trash enclosure is located to the northwest of the place of worship, with a setback of zero feet from the north property line requiring a waiver of development standards. Two existing storage buildings, each measuring 48 square feet, are located on the northeastern portion of the site with a 5 foot setback from the rear and side yards, and a minimum separation of 6 feet between structures. An existing pool is located within the rear yard of the project site; however, the pool appears to be empty based on recent aerial photographs. The place of worship is required to have 37 parking spaces, and 37 parking spaces are depicted on the plans, with 34 parking spaces located to the west of the building and 3 parking spaces located on the southeastern corner of the site. Six parking spaces are designed as parallel with a minimum length of 21 feet and width of 9 feet, meeting Code standards. The on-site/circulation of vehicles is serviced by a one-way circular drive aisle, ranging between 10 feet to 18 feet in width. Bicycle spaces are located at the northwest corner of the building. Access to the site is granted via a single, existing 20 foot driveway along Spencer Street, requiring a waiver to reduce the required width of the driveway. An existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalk is located along Spencer Street.

Landscaping

Per the approved plans the existing attached sidewalk along Spencer Street will remain and no street landscaping is proposed along the right-of-way, which required a waiver of development standards. The interior of the parking lot features a central landscape area with 11 existing palm

trees, 8 of which will be removed to accommodate the drive aisle width and parking adjacent to the place of worship. Per the Development Code, palm trees are not allowed in the interior of parking lots as they provide minimal shade; therefore, a waiver is necessary to eliminate parking lot landscaping. Five existing palm trees are provided along a portion of the southwest property line, adjacent to a single-family residence, which will be removed to allow for parking along the south property line. The plan depicts 4 existing palm trees along a portion of the northwest property line, adjacent to the drainage channel. No other perimeter landscaping is provided along the northeast, east, and southeast property lines of the project site, which are adjacent to singlefamily residences. Waivers are being requested to eliminate landscaping adjacent to the existing residential uses. An existing 6 foot high CMU block wall surrounds the perimeter of the project site.

The approved plans depict an existing place of worship consisting of a stucco exterior and an asphalt shingled roof. The height of the existing building is 20 feet to the top of the pitched roof and 23 feet to the top of the cross. The exterior of the building is painted with neutral, earth tone colors. The height of the existing metal carport is 8 feet. The existing storage buildings are 7.5 feet in height. The storage buildings consist of an asphalt shingled roof with exterior wood siding. The storage buildings are painted with neutral earth tone colors.

The approved plans depict a 3,653 square foot place of worship consisting of a front and main sanctuary area, prayer room, media room, restroom facilities, children's room, kitchen, mass hall, storage and equipment rooms, and pantry.

Title 30 standards of approval for an extension of time state an application may be denied if it is found that circumstances have substantially changed. A substantial change may include, without limitation, a change to the subject property, a change in the areas surrounding the subject property, or a change in the laws, regulations, or policies affecting the subject property. Additionally, the applicant must demonstrate the project is progressing through the applicable development permit or licensing process.

The location is impacted by an existing drainage channel which creates unique circumstances for the development of the site. The applicant states that they have been working with the Fire Department to address the fire requirements for the project. Records show that the applicant has submitted a drainage study (PW25-17190) for review by Public Works. Additionally, BD24-40111 is a building permit application in review with the Building Department for interior tenant improvements to address the issues for CE-19-17787 with CCPRO. Staff finds the applicant has demonstrated that they are trying to make progress for the completion of the project. This application is contingent upon UC-21-0184, the use permit that approved the use of the site as a place of worship, remaining active. Staff can support this extension of time request. However, since the land use applications were approved to allow the site to be a place of worship, the County has adopted a rewrite to Title 30 effective January 1, 2024, and projects are expected to comply with the new regulations. Therefore, staff may not support future extension of time requests.

Site Plans

The plans provided depict a currently undeveloped 7.55 acre T-shaped parcel located at the southeast corner of Wynn Road and Pioneer Avenue. The proposed shopping center development will be located in the western and southern portions of the site with the development taking up 4.91 acres. The plans show the 73,482 square foot shopping center will consist of 6 separate building situated in the center of the site extending from Pioneer Avenue south to Spring Mountain Road.

Buildings A and B are located in the southern portion of APN 162-18-506-008 and are set back 4 feet from the side property lines and 10 feet behind the attached sidewalk along Spring Mountain Road. Both buildings are situated 72 feet apart from each other. Approximately 30 feet north of both Building A and B are Buildings C and E with both buildings set back 4 feet from the side property lines of APN 162-18-506-008. Building C continues up to the northern property line of APN 162-18-506-008. Building E is L-shaped and continues into APN 162-18-506-001 for approximately 50 feet and extends to the east for approximately 50 feet. This building is set back 10 feet from southeast property line of APN 16-18-506-001 and 118 feet from the eastern boundary of the project. Building D is located 6.7 feet north of Building C. Building D is set back 6.7 to 25 feet from the southwest property line of APN 162-18-506-001 and is set back 146 feet from Wynn Road. Building F is the northernmost building and is shown back 56 feet from Pioneer Avenue, 80 feet north of Building D and E, 118 feet from the eastern project boundary, and 138 feet from Wynn Road. Buildings A through E have north-south orientations, while Building F has an east-west orientation.

The plans also show several community features that include outdoor dining areas, shaded areas, sculptures, and a playground. A playground and landscaped seating area is shown between Buildings A and C and Building B and D. An entrance archway spans the driveway along Spring Mountain Road and is setback 10 feet from Spring Mountain Road. A large scale vaulted circular sculpture piece is located centrally on the site and is north of Buildings D and E and south of Building F with an overall diameter of 110 feet. Outdoor dining areas are shown in the northeast corner of Building D, the northwest corner of Building E, and the south-central portion of Building F adjacent to the circular sculpture. Additional shaded seating areas are shown on both sides of the drive aisle south of the circular sculpture and just north of the entrance archway. Due to these outside dining and activity spaces, the applicant is requesting use permits for live entertainment, a recreational facility, and outside dining. These use permits will allow outside dining along with outdoor cultural performances and events to be conducted in the outdoor public spaces. These use permits are needed as these uses could be located as little as 118 feet from the RM50 zoned property to the east.

Access to the site is provided by 3 commercial driveways located along Spring Mountain Road, Wynn Road, and Pioneer Avenue. The Spring Mountain Road driveway is located centrally along the southern property line of APN 162-18-506-008, is 37 feet wide and will be an entry only one-way driveway that connects to a drive aisle running between Building A, B, C, and E up to a central east-west drive aisle that results in a "T" intersection, located between Buildings D, E, and F.. This east-west drive aisle will be one-way with the direction of travel being outward from the intersection on each side of the north-south drive aisle. Along Wynn Road, the driveway is 36 feet wide and located centrally along the western property line of APN 162-18-

506-001. The driveway along Pioneer Avenue is located in the northeast corner of the project area and will be 36 feet wide. These driveways access a series of 24 foot wide drive aisles that provide access to the site and the parking area. Additional drive aisles are provided to the north, east, and west of Building D, E, and F and access the surrounding parking area with all remaining drive aisles being two-way.

Parking is provided throughout the site but is particularly situated in the northern portion of the project area on APN 162-18-506-001. Parking in the northern portion of the site is located to the east, north, and west sides of the buildings and is located various parking counts. Parking is also located on both sides of the east-west central drive aisles and along both sides of the north-south drive aisle. A total of 171 parking spaces are being provided where 171 parking spaces are required.

Landscaping

The plans provided show street and parking lot landscaping will be provided throughout the site. In terms of street landscaping, all 3 street frontages will have landscaping areas. Along Spring Mountain Road, a 10 foot wide landscaping strip is being provided behind the existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalk. Since the attached sidewalk will remain, a waiver of development standards is required. Within this landscape area, 4 Shoestring Acacia (Acacia Stenophylla) trees will be provided every 30 feet on center where Large trees are required. Along both Wynn Road and Pioneer Avenue, a 15 foot wide landscaping area is being provided consisting of a 5 foot landscape strip along the street followed by a 5 foot wide sidewalk followed by another 5 foot wide landscaping strip. Within the landscaping area along both streets are a mixed of Shoestring Acacia and Desert Museum Palo Verde (Cercidium sp.) frees in alternating rows, where possible. spaced every 20 feet on center. Along Wynn Road, a total of 10 trees are provided where 8 trees are required, and, along Pioneer Avehue, a total of 20 trees are provided where 16 trees are required. Within the parking area, terminal landscape finger islands are being provided at the ends of each row of parking with additional finger islands provided where the rows contain more than 6 spaces. In general, a landscape finger island is provided every 4 to 12 spaces. Each finger island contains a Desert Willow (Chilopsis Linearis) tree with a total of 57 such trees being provided where 29 trees are required in the parking area. Additionally, 2 buffers are also being provided where not required. With a 10 foot wide landscape area being provided along the eastern boundary of the project and another 10 foot wide landscape area being provided along the southwest boundary of the site. Both landscape areas contain Shoestring Acacia trees in a single row spaced approximately 10 feet apparat on center.

Elèvations

The elevations show the proposed buildings will all contain a similar architectural theme and will range in height from 28 to 50 feet in height. Buildings A and B will both be 2-story buildings and will reach 39 feet in height while Buildings C, D, and E will be 37 feet tall and will contain only 1 floor. Building F will be a maximum of 50 feet tall with a single story on the west and east ends of the building but will have a second level in the center of the building. Overall, the building will be constructed of concrete and stucco panels but will use a variety of vertical wood, decorative metal screens, lighting fixtures, and glass to create various accents, framing, and architectural enhancements. All building fronts have pedestrian awnings for shading. The rooflines of the various building will vary between flat, pitched, and curvilinear roofs and with

various materials used such as metal tile. The overall aesthetic of the shopping center is inspired by the various cultures of East Asia.

Floor Plans

The plans provided show generalized shell suites within the 6 proposed buildings. Overall, a total of 50 suites are shown with the area of these suites ranging from 900 square feet up to 2,848 square feet. Both Buildings A and B will have 5 suites on their ground floor and 2 suites on their second floor with the suites ranging in size from 1,089 square feet up to 1,980 square feet for Building A. Building B's suites will range in size from 1,070 square feet up to 1,827 square feet. Building C will contain 4 suites ranging in size from 988 square feet up to 1,293 square while Building D will contain 7 suites ranging in size from 900 square feet up to 2,848 square feet. Building E will have 11 suites with a minimum size of 900 square feet and a maximum size of 1,335 square feet. Building F will have 10 suites on the first floor and 4 suites on the upper floor with the suites ranging from 1,436 square feet up to 1,860 square feet.

Applicant's Justification

The increased drive aisle length and reduced throat depth is justified as the drive aisle increase in minor and the shopping center has provided wider sidewalks and other pedestrian friendly features. Allowing the existing attached sidewalk along Spring Mountain Road is justified as there is an ongoing project along Spring Mountain Road to improve the streetscape and the sidewalk could be modified sometime soon. Additionally, the requests for recreational facilities, outdoor dining, and live entertainment as well as the project are justified as the site is located within the Chinatown cultural district where there are already similar commercial developments with such uses approved. Additionally, many of these same developments are located next to or within mixed-use or multi-family developments.

Analysis

Comprehensive Planning

Use Permits

A special use permit is considered on a case by case basis in consideration of the standards for approval. Additionally, the use shall not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on

adjacent properties, character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare; and will be adequately served by public improvements, facilities, and services, and will not impose an undue burden.

The neighborhood surrounding the proposed shopping center development contains a wide variety of uses and structures. Directly across Spring Mountain Road is an existing large-scale retail and restaurant complex, with most of the block between Valley View Boulevard and Arville Street containing a similar mix of uses. In addition, most of the areas to the north and west of the subject are industrial in nature would not be impacted by live entertainment, outdoor dining, or recreational facilities, like arcades and similar uses. Additionally, the surrounding area has a strong pedestrian and commercial presence that would receive benefits from additional uses such as live entertainment and recreational facilities. The proposed development has also provided additional buffering to help filter any impacts that could come upon the existing and future uses to the east and south. Several of shopping centers and plazas along Spring Mountain Road already have outdoor dining facilities and are mostly buffered by the buildings on-site. Ultimately, Staff finds the addition of such uses in this area would contribute to the entertainment and dining character of the Chinatown neighborhood and there are limited residential developments in the area that would be affected by the proposed uses. Staff finds the proposed used will support Clark County Master Plan Policies 5.1.3 and 5.5.3 and Winchester/Paradise Specific Policy WP-3.1 which encourage the development of business and employment opportunities which support the economic base of the Las Vegas Valley, particularly those that encourage the development and redevelopment of vacant and underused land. For these reasons, staff can support these requests,

Waivers of Development Standards

The applicant shall have the burden of proof to establish that the proposed request is appropriate for its proposed location by showing the following: 1) the use(s) of the area adjacent to the subject property will not be affected in a substantially adverse manner; 2) the proposal will not materially affect the health and safety of persons residing in, working in, or visiting the immediate vicinity, and will not be materially detrimental to the public welfare; and 3) the proposal will be adequately served by, and will not create an undue burden on, any public improvements, facilities, or services.

Waiver of Development Standards #1

The purpose of limiting drive aisle length within commercial development is to limit possible traffic conflicts and to allow easy exit access during times of high traffic volume. Staff finds in this case the length of the north-south drive aisle is just above the maximum length and much of the length of the drive aisle if landscaped or pedestrian areas where there are no traffic conflicts. Also the drive aisle is one-way with 2 lanes towards the center of the site so there should also be less traffic causing potential conflicts. Staff also finds the shopping center is well connected to the surrounding areas through larger sidewalks and walkways and Spring Mountain Road has several public transit routes which would help to reduce on-site traffic conflicts. As a result, staff can support this request.

Design Review

Development of the subject property is reviewed to determine if 1) it is compatible with adjacent development and is harmonious and compatible with development in the area; 2) the elevations, design characteristics and others architectural and aesthetic features are not unsightly or undesirable in appearance; and 3) site access and circulation do not negatively impact adjacent roadways or neighborhood traffic.

Staff finds the proposed shopping center will contribute to the pedestrian centered character of the Spring Mountain and Chinatown neighborhood by using wider sidewalks, shade awnings, street landscaping, and a welcoming aesthetic. The architecture used is interesting and varied and adds to the unique character of the Chinatown neighborhood. On-site circulation directs users to the center of the site in an efficient manner and has several points of ingress and egress. The site is well landscaped and contains sufficient parking. The proposed uses of the site will be within the character of the surrounding area and with limited residential uses should not cause any additional burden. The site will activate a previously undeveloped area that has previously been approved for similar and even larger scale shopping centers and uses. Given the attractive nature of the proposed building, the orderly design of the site, the enhanced pedestrian nature of the development, and its conformance with the character and uses of the neighborhood, staff can support this request.

Staff has no objection to allowing the existing attached sidewalks to remain along Spring Mountain Road since there is a Public Works project for this area.

Waiver of Development Standards #3

Staff has no objection to the reduced throat death for the driveway along Spring Mountain Road. The applicant worked closely with staff to redesign the Spring Mountain Road driveway, improving safety by converting it to a one-way entrance only driveway.

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to respectfully submit this justification letter in support of our proposed commercial development on approximately 9.44 acres located near the intersection of Spring Mountain Road, and Valley View Boulevard. As you are aware, this corridor has become a vital and dynamic hub within the Las Vegas Valley—one that continues to evolve in response to local demand, regional growth, and cultural significance. We are submitting for a design review, and a zone change for the subject site.

We are asking for a use of recreational facility and live entertainment as well.

Waivers of Development Standards:

- Increase drive isle length from 400 feet to 450 feet, due to our design layout for this site plan, we have created a site plan where sidewalks are up to 25 feet wide to make this a more pedestrian friendly shopping experience. We also try to keep all the stores next to each other to make it have the feeling of an outdoor mall shopping experience. We feel that this wavier is justified since we are creating an outdoor mall experience for everyone with pedestrian friendly attributes.
- Leaving the attached sidewalk on Spring Mountain Road, per our conversations with Public Works, the existing attached sidewalk on Spring Mountain will stay in place. Developer will agree to sign a SID agreement with the County for the major project as part of the Spring Mountain redevelopment plans being proposed by Public Works and the County.
- Throat depth, asking for a waiver of development standards to reduce the throat depth to 88.5 feet where 100 feet is the requirement. The proposed driveway from Spring Mountain is ingress only, therefore we feel that 88.5 feet is sufficient.

Economic Opportunity & Community Enhancement

This development is envisioned not just as a set of buildings, but as a community asset—an active, thoughtfully curated commercial destination that responds directly to the needs of the local population. In recent years, successful projects like **Shanghai Plaza** have proven that commercial centers, when thoughtfully designed and programmed, can deliver outstanding public impacts. Since opening, Shanghai Plaza has generated dozens of local jobs, drawn in significant foot traffic, supported small businesses, and cultivated a safe, engaging environment for both residents and visitors. Site Plan

The site of the proposed drive-thru restaurants is 1.1 acres and located on the northwest corner of Flamingo Road and Pinecrest Street. The site is currently developed with an existing 6,000 square foot bank branch office building and it is proposed to be demolished to make way for the proposed restaurants. The proposed restaurant buildings will be centered on the southern portion of the site with one restaurant building located in the west half of the site and the other restaurant building located in the east half of the site. The west restaurant building will be 1,025 square feet and rectangular in shape with a north-south orientation. This building will be set back 42 feet from Flamingo Road, 35 feet from the west property line, and 135 feet from the north property line. A 500 square foot covered outdoor dining area is proposed along the southeast portion of the restaurant building and will be 155 feet from the residential uses to the north. The east restaurant building will be 2,650 square feet and rectangular in shape with a north-south orientation. This building will be set back 41 feet from Flamingo Road, 32 feet from Pinecrest Street to the east, and 91 feet from the north property line. The 2 restaurant buildings will be separated from each other by 95 feet.

The site will be accessed by 2 existing pan driveways with 1 located along Flamingo Road and the other along Pinecrest Street. The Flamingo Road driveway is 31 feet wide and located in the southwest corner of the site but is located entirely within the existing right-of-way of Flamingo Road. The Pinecrest Street driveway is 32 feet wide and located in the northeast corner of the site. Since these driveways will not be constructed to the commercial curb return driveway standards, a waiver of development standards is required. Additionally, the applicant is maintaining the existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalks along Flamingo Road and Pinecrest Street. Since Title 30 requires attached sidewalks to be reconstructed as detached sidewalks, a waiver of development standards is required to maintain the attached sidewalks.

These driveways will access 2 east-west drive aisles located in the northern and southern portions of the site. The northern drive aisle is approximately 32 feet wide while the southern drive aisle varies between 24 feet and 25 feet. A central north-south drive aisle is 24 feet wide and has parking located on each side of the drive aisle adjacent to both restaurant buildings. The parking area contains 18 total parking spaces with 10 spaces on the west side of the drive aisle and 8 spaces on the east side of the drive aisle. An additional 13 parking spaces are located south of the southern drive aisles but are located entirely within the Flamingo Road right-of-way. As a result, those spaces cannot count toward the required number of parking spaces, so a total of 18 parking spaces are provided on-site where 24 spaces are required, thus requiring a waiver of development standards.

Each restaurant building has an associated drive-thru that connects with the on-site circulation of the site. The drive-thru associated with the west restaurant building starts with double drive-thru lanes north of the restaurant, and flows in a counterclockwise direction. The drive-thru lanes merge into 1 lane along the west property line. The menu boards are located after the curve of the drive-thru lanes heading south toward the pick-up window. All menu boards face west away from the residential areas to the north. The vehicles will exit south toward the drive-way along Flamingo Road. This drive-thru is set back 15 feet from the residential uses to the north.

The drive-thru associated with the east restaurant building starts at the east of the southern drive aisle and is a 12 foot wide single lane drive-thru. This drive-thru circles the restaurant building along the east, north, and west sides of the building and flows in a counterclockwise direction. The menu board is located at the northeast corner of the restaurant building. The menu board faces east away from the residential uses to the north. The drive-thru exits out into the southern drive aisle just to the west of where the drive-thru begins. This drive-thru is set back 63 feet from the residential uses to the north. Due to the location of both proposed drive-thru lanes for both proposed restaurants, waivers to modify residential adjacency standards are required.

Landscaping

The landscape plans indicate street, parking lot, and screening and buffering landscaping will be provided on the site. In terms of street landscaping, along Pinecrest Street, a 10 foot wide landscaping strip will be provided behind the existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalk. This landscape strip will consist of a single row of 6 Thorntess Palo Verde (Parkinsonia sp.) trees, and an existing Mesquite species tree spaced every 20 feet where 7 large trees are required. Along Flamingo Road, the existing 5 foot wide landscaping area will remain and contains 2 existing Mesquite trees with 1 Shoestring Acacia (Acacia Stenophylla) tree being added. This area, however, is completely within the existing Flamingo Road right-of-way and therefore cannot count toward the required street landscaping and a waiver of development standards is required. To mitigate this, the applicant is providing 1 Shoestring Acacia tree on-site along the right-of-way, 3 Shoestring Acacia trees in a 10 foot wide landscape strip along the western boundary, and 2 Shoestring Acacia trees within a planting area north of the western restaurant building for a total of 6 large trees where 6 large trees would be required.

Within the parking area, a total of Thornless Palo Verde trees are provided where 6 medium or large trees are required. On the west side of the parking area, terminal landscape islands are provided with trees with an additional tree provided in the planting area north of the restaurant building to serve as a parking lot tree. In the eastern portion of the parking, terminal landscape islands are provided with a central landscape finger island in the middle of the parking row. This allows a tree to be placed every 4 spaces.

Buffering and screening landscaping is also provided along the northern boundary of the site within a 15 foot wide landscaping strip. Within this landscaping strip, are 2 rows of Mulga Acacia (Acacia Aneura) trees spaced 10 feet apart with an 8 foot tall decorative block wall along the northern property line of the site. Additionally, 2 existing Mesquite trees have been incorporated into the screening buffer as well.

Each restaurant building has an associated drive-thru that connects with the on-site circulation of the site. The drive-thru associated with the west restaurant building starts with double drive-thru lanes north of the restaurant, and flows in a counterclockwise direction. The drive-thru lanes merge into 1 lane along the west property line. The menu boards are located after the curve of the drive-thru lanes heading south toward the pick-up window. All menu boards face west away from the residential areas to the north. The vehicles will exit south toward the drive-way along Flamingo Road. This drive-thru is set back 15 feet from the residential uses to the north.

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Landscaping

The landscape plans indicate street, parking lot, and screening and buffering landscaping will be provided on the site. In terms of street landscaping, along Pinecrest Street, a 10 foot wide landscaping strip will be provided behind the existing 5 foot wide attached sidewalk. This landscape strip will consist of a single row of 6 Thornless Palo Verde (Parkinsonia sp.) trees, and an existing Mesquite species tree spaced every 20 feet where 7 large trees are required. Along Flamingo Road, the existing 5 foot wide landscaping area will remain and contains 2 existing Mesquite trees with 1 Shoestring Acacia (Acacia Stenophylla) tree being added. This area, however, is completely within the existing Flamingo Road right-of-way and therefore cannot count toward the required street landscaping and a waiver of development standards is required. To mitigate this, the applicant is providing 1 Shoestring Acacia tree on-site along the right-of-way, 3 Shoestring Acacia trees in a 10 foot wide landscape strip along the western boundary, and 2 Shoestring Acacia trees within a planting area north of the western restaurant building for a total of 6 large trees where 6 large trees would be required.

Within the parking area, a total of Thornless Palo Verde trees are provided where 6 medium or large trees are required. On the west side of the parking area, terminal landscape islands are provided with trees with an additional tree provided in the planting area north of the restaurant building to serve as a parking lot tree. In the eastern portion of the parking, terminal landscape islands are provided with a central landscape finger island in the middle of the parking row. This allows a tree to be placed every 4 spaces.

Buffering and screening landscaping is also provided along the northern boundary of the site within a Notot wide landscaping strip. Within this landscaping strip, are 2 rows of Mulga Acacia (Acacia Aneura) trees spaced 10 feet apart with an 8 foot tall decorative block wall along the northern property line of the site. Additionally, 2 existing Mesquite trees have been incorporated into the screening buffer as well.

Overall, 2 existing trees located on the site that are considered significant trees will be removed with 6 new trees replacing those lost trees. The new trees are mainly Western Redbud (Cercis Occidentalis) trees and Thornless Palo Verde trees that have been placed in the landscape strip along the western boundary and the planting area norther of the western restaurant building.

Elevations & Floor Plans

West Restaurant Building

This building is a typical commercial restaurant building and stands 24 feet tall. The exterior of the building is primarily grey colored stucco with blue fiber cement accenting. The roof is a flat roof with cool roof elements. Roof extensions and wall pop-outs are found on all elevations. A stone veneer accent runs along the entire base of the building. There is a main order/pick-up window located on the southeast portion of the building with the drive-thru located on the southwest portion of the building. All windows and doors have associated awnings. A 12 foot tall outside dining patio is found on the east side of the building. The interior of the building shows the building contains 1,025 square feet with a majority of the area dedicated to a food production area with the remaining spaces being an office, cooler, and restroom.

East Restaurant Building

This building is also a typical commercial restaurant building with franchise architecture and stands 24.2 feet tall. The exterior of the building is primarily blue colored hardi-board siding with red and white siding elements and accenting. The roof is a flavroof with cool roof elements. Roof extensions, wall breaks, and wall pop-outs are found on all elevations. A grey brick veneer accent runs along the entire base of the south and east facades of the building. There is a main entrance located on the south façade of the building consisting of an aluminum commercial window/door system. The drive-thru is located on the southwest portion of the building. All windows and doors have associated awnings. The interior of the building shows the building contains 2,650 square feet with a majority of the area dedicated to a dining room and food preop areas with the remaining spaces being an office, cooler, storage, and restroom.

Applicant's Justification

The outside dining area should not create any burdens to the residential areas to the north due to the provided screening landscape buffer and the outside dining area is more located and oriented towards Flamingo Road. The reduced separation of the drive-thru lanes to the residential uses to the north is justified due to the screening landscaping buffer along the northern property line along with the fact the property directly to the north is planned for commercial uses and could have been used as such. Additionally, all menu boards and talk boxes are directed away from the residential uses to the north. The reduction of parking and landscaping due to their placement in the Plamingo Road right-of-way is justified due to an existing lease for this area with the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) and additional landscaping has been provided throughout the site to make up for the loss of such landscaping. The Pinecrest Street driveway and sidewalk and the maintenance of the existing condition would not impact the surrounding area due to the limited traffic along Pinecrest Street.

STANDARDS FOR APPROVAL:

The applicant shall demonstrate that the proposed request is consistent with the Master Plan and is in compliance with Title 30.

Analysis

Comprehensive Planning

Use Permit

A special use permit is considered on a case by case basis in consideration of the standards for approval. Additionally, the use shall not result in a substantial or undue adverse effect on adjacent properties, character of the neighborhood, traffic conditions, parking, public improvements, public sites or right-of-way, or other matters affecting the public health, safety, and general welfare; and will be adequately served by public improvements, facilities, and services, and will not impose an undue burden.

The purpose of reviewing outdoor dining uses is to assure the proposed outdoor dining area is sufficiently set back from neighboring residential uses, appropriate buffering and mitigation measures are being provided, and to assure the site of the proposed use is appropriate for outside dining. In this case, staff finds the proposed separation of the outdoor dining area to the residential uses to the north is 155 feet with both a screening landscape buffer and a drive-thru located between the outdoor dining area and the residential uses. Staff finds this separation combined with the buffer and other uses should help to reduce the impact the outdoor dining area will have on surrounding residential uses. Additionally, the outdoor dining area is more oriented towards the Flamingo Road frontage, which should keep noise and other disturbances from being audible from the residential uses. As a result, staff can support this request.

Waivers of Development Standards

The applicant shall have the burden of proof to establish that the proposed request is appropriate for its proposed location by showing the following: 1) the use(s) of the area adjacent to the subject property will not be affected in a substantially adverse manner; 2) the proposal will not materially affect the health and safety of persons residing in, working in, or visiting the immediate vicinity, and will not be materially detrimental to the public welfare; and 3) the proposal will be adequately served by, and will not create an undue burden on, any public improvements, facilities, or services.

Waivers of Development Standards #1 & #2

Parking stall minimum standards and street landscaping are important to ensure that a lask of parking does not disturb the surrounding area or lead to traffic disruptions, and street landscaping allows pedestrian streetscapes to remain cooler due to a reduction in the heat island effect. In this case, the applicant is providing parking stalls and street landscaping within a portion of the site that is located within the Flamingo Road right-of-way. The parking and landscaping provided within the right-of-way is an issue as this landscaping and parking stalls could be removed at the request of NDOT at any time leaving the site under parked and without any street landscaping. Since the site is being reconstructed, staff finds the site could have been designed to accommodate more parking on-site and the required street landscaping could have been placed along the street as required. While staff can appreciate the placement of additional trees throughout the site to make up for the lack of street landscaping, the proposed additional trees are not provided in locations which would make a comfortable streetscape. As a result, staff is unable to support these requests.

Waiver of Development Standards #3

The purpose of ensuring a significant separation between residential uses and drive-thru lanes is to prevent the noise and odors that come from such uses disturbing surrounding residential areas. In this case, the proposed drive-thru lanes are between 15 and 63 feet from the residential uses to the north. The applicant is proposing a screening landscape buffer that should reduce possible noise and odors. Staff also finds that all menu boards and talk boxes have been oriented away from the residential uses to the north. With that said, staff finds the site is being reconstructed and the design of the site could have been set up to increase the distance of the drive-thru lanes to the northern boundary. Additionally, additional buffering could also have been provided to provide additional screening and buffering where the drive-thru lanes will be closest to the northern boundary of the site. For these reasons, staff is unable to support this request.

Design Review

Development of the subject property is reviewed to determine if 1) it is compatible with adjacent development and is harmonious and compatible with development in the area; 2) the elevations, design characteristics and others architectural and aesthetic features are not unsightly or undesirable in appearance; and 3) site access and circulation do not negatively impact adjacent roadways or neighborhood traffic.

The proposed design of the site orients most of the uses proposed towards the south along the Flamingo Road frontage, which creates a more pedestrian oriented site and keeps the uses away from the residential uses to the north. Additionally, the applicant is providing enough parking lot

landscaping and additional landscaping to make up for significant trees that are already present on the site. The landscaping buffer along the north is also provided per Code. The buildings proposed on the site primarily consist of franchise architecture which is typical of the commercial uses that are found along Flamingo Road. Staff also finds the repurposing of the site from its currently blighted condition to the proposed restaurants will be a benefit to the Elamingo Road corridor and the residential uses to north and will increase the safety of the area. With that said, staff finds that since the site is being reconstructed, the existing parking and landscaping within the Flamingo Road right-of-way could have been removed and reconstructed on-site. Additionally, staff finds additional buffering could have been provided to reduce the impacts the drive-thru lanes may have on the residential uses to the north. Ultimately, staff finds the proposed design and uses comply with Master Plan Policies 1,4.4, 5.1.5 and 6.1.6 and Winchester/Paradise Specific Policy WP-3.1, which support adaptive reuse of aging or blighted commercial properties and the use infill development where possible to reduce impacts on existing infrastructure. With that said, Staff also finds the proposed development does not support Policy 1.4.5 and Winchester/Paradise Specific Policy WP-1.1, which encourage the development of non-auto-centric uses along high-capacity transit routes and the uses of appropriate buffers between residential uses and more intense commercial uses. For these reasons, staff is unable to able to support this request.

Public Works - Development Review

Waiver of Development Standards #4

Staff cannot support the request to allow the existing attached sidewalks to remain on Pinecrest Street. Detached sidewalks offer improved pedestrian safety by increasing the distance between pedestrians and vehicular traffic. Staff finds that it is imperative to provide detached sidewalks.

Waiver of Development Standards #5

Staff has no objection to allowing the existing curb return driveways to remain on Pinecrest Street. The applicant worked with staff construct a 5 foot sidewalk behind the existing driveway to maintain ADA compliance.

Staff Recommendation

Approval of the use permit; denial of the waivers of development standards and design review.

If this request is approved, the Board and/or Commission finds that the application is consistent with the standards and purpose enumerated in the Master Plan, Title 30, and/or the Nevada Revised Statutes.

To Whom It May Concern:

On behalf of our Client, BP Flamingo LLC., we respectfully submit this application package for a proposed commercial development consisting of two freestanding restaurant buildings each with a drive-through window. The parcel is currently developed and has a building which was formerly a Bank of America location. The existing building will be demolished to accommodate the proposed project. The proposed project is located on the northwest corner of Flamingo Road and Pinecrest Street. The parcel is a total 1.1 acres and is zoned CG (Commercial General). The parcel is located within the Paradise Town Board Planning Area.

Project Description:

The proposed Dutch Bros restaurant is 1,025 square feet with a 500 square foot outside dining area located on the west side of the site. The two drive-thru lanes for the Dutch Bros are along the north and west sides of the building and site and merges into one lane at the southwestern portion of the building. The drive-thru lanes are buffered from the north property line with a proposed minimum 15 foot wide landscaping area and eight (8) foot high wall. The menu boards and call boxes are located on the west side of the building and site. The proposed Zaxby restaurant is 2,650 square feet and is located on the east side of the site. The drive-thru lane is along the northern, western, and eastern sides of the buildings adjacent to Flamingo Road and Pinecrest Street. The site is accessed by two (2) driveways; one (1) located on Flamingo Road; and the other driveways is on Pinecrest Street. A total of 27 parking spaces are required for the site; however total of 31 parking spaces are provided within the allowable 15% increase allowed by Code. The plans depict 18 spaces located on-site and 13 located within the Flamingo Road right-of-way. Two (2) handicap accessible spaces are provided whereas one (1) is required by

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Code. Four (4) bicycle spaces are provided per Code. A total of two (2) trash enclosures are provided, one each adjacent to the respective restaurant building. No loading zones are provided since none is required by Code. An eight (8) foot high wall is proposed along the north property line, and its construction will comply with Code requirements. Some parking spaces and portions of the alternative landscaping proposed for the site is within the Flamingo Road easement. A lease agreement is provided for the NDOT easement. This was an existing condition with the previous development on the site (Bank). The lease with NDOT allows the proposed design of the site which will maintain existing conditions along the Flamingo Road frontage of the site. A lease is provided from NDOT for the right-of-way area along the front property line.

Landscaping:

A proposed alternative landscaping area with an existing five (5) foot wide attached sidewalk along the frontage of the parcel is located within the Flamingo Road easement. Only a portion of the landscaping depicted along Flamingo Road is within the property line ranging from three (3) feet to ten (10 feet) wide. Landscaping ranging from 15 feet up to approximately 20 feet with a five foot wide attached sidewalk is depicted along Pinecrest Street. Proposed landscaping ranging from 15 feet up to a minimum of 21 feet wide is proposed with a proposed 8 foot high wall along the north property line. A minimum ten (10) landscape area is depicted along the west property line.

Elevations:

The Dutch Bros building is up to 24 feet high to the top of the parapets. The building materials consist of stucco wall finishes with contrasting and complimentary colors. Design accents include stone veneers, painted metal awnings and strips, doors, and windows with aluminum and glass store front doors and windows. The colors consist of complementary and contrasting colors for the brand. The Zaxby's building ranges in height from 9 feet up to 24 feet 2.5 inches. The building materials consist of stucco wall finishes with contrasting and complimentary colors. Design accents include stone veneers, painted metal awnings and strips, doors, and windows with aluminum and glass store front doors and windows. The colors consist of complementary and contrasting colors for each respective brand.

Floor Plans:

The Dutch Bros' plan is 1,025 square feet and is divided to show the room schedule as required by Code per the Brand's layout. The Dutch Bros has a 500 square foot outside dining area. The Zaxby's is 2,650 and divided to show the room schedule required by Code and per the Brand's layout.

Signage is not a part of this application.

The following are the required applications for the project:

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Special Use Permit:

Reduce the separation of the outside dining area (Dutch Bros) to the residential areas to the north to 155.5 feet where 200 feet is required.

Justification:

The outdoor dining area is located east of the Dutch Bros building and is south of the drive though lanes. The area screened and buffered by the required 15 foot wide buffer area along the north property line and the additional landscaping provided between the drive-through lanes and the dining area. The landscaping will both screen, buffer, eliminate visual impact and mitigate any perceived noise from this area which is closer to Flamingo Road than the residential uses to the north.

Waivers of Development Standards:

- 1) Waive the following Residential Adjacency Standards. (30.04.06D)
 - a. Reduce the setback for the drive-through lane for the Dutch Bros to 15 feet where a 200 foot setback is the standard. (30.04.06)
 - b. Reduce the setback for the drive-through lane for the Zaxby's to 63.25 feet where a 200 foot setback is the standard. (30.04.06)

Justification:

The proposed drive-thru lane from the northern property line is a minimum to 15 feet buffered/screened from the residential development by landscaping with the same width and an eight (8) foot high wall. The parcel to the north was previously developed as a residence which is now demolished, however, there is a residential permit in process but not yet constructed. The parcel is designated in the Master Plan as Neighborhood Commercial (NC), therefore could have been a commercial use. Additionally, there is a commercial development on the subject site. The drive-thru lane for the Zaxby's is oriented in a south to north direction and is not immediately adjacent to the north property line and will, therefore, not impact the parcel to the north which is undeveloped at this time and since designated as NC in the Master Plan. Additionally, the Zaxbys building is buffered and screened by q 9.7 foot wide landscape area which will mitigate any perceived impact. The call boxes, pay and pick-up windows are all set back a minimum of 40 feet from the north property line which also reduces noise, environmental and visual impact for the existing and future residential use.

2) Reduce the required landscaping along the Flamingo Road street frontage (within the property line) and allow an alternative landscaping where portions of the required landscaping is provided within Flamingo Road where required within the property line (on-site). 30.04.01



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Justification:

Lanscaping provided along Flamingo Road is partially within the right-of-way and on-site. Portions of the landscaping within the right-of-way easement is existing consists of mostly ground cover and shrubs and two trees. This landscaping is enhanced with an additional tree is included in the r-o-w. Additional street frontage landscaping is provided on-site north of the drive aisle for the parking spaces within the r-o-w easement. The landscape plan provided the details of the landscaping provided for the site. Additionally, some of the required trees are provided on the west property line of the site where a landscaping is not required. This request will maintain an approved and existing condition.

3) Reduce on-site parking spaces to 18 spaces where 24 spaces are required by Code. 30.04.02.

Justification:

The required parking for the site 27 parking spaces, however, this requirement is reduced to 24 spaces (10%) because a of a transit stop is located approximately 600 feet of the site. The plans depict that only 18 spaces of the required 24 spaces are located on-site. The remaining six (6) spaces including an addition seven (7) spaces for a total of 13 spaces are located with the Flamingo Road right-of-way easement. The plans depict a total of 31 parking spaces (both on-site and off-site) for the uses on the site. Parking provided exceeds the 15% allow by Code and is at 29%. This design depicts both portions of both landscaping and parking within the Flamingo Road r-o-w. A lease is provided from NDOT allowing the landscaping and parking in the easement. This design and request is an existing condition for the site and other properties along this portion of the Flamingo Road frontage. This request will not impact the site or area since it is an existing condition for the previous bank building on the site.

4) Permit an attached sidewalk along the street frontage (Pinecrest Street) where a detached sidewalk is the standard in Clark County. 30.04.08

Justification:

The sidewalks along Pinecrest Street are existing and match the existing the sidewalks for the adjacent developments on both sides of the street in the area. Therefore, the request is to maintain the existing for continuity of the developments in the. This is a redevelopment of a site and an infill project. The applicant also wants to maintain the existing condition on the site as the previous development. An attached sidewalk exists along Flamingo Road which is an NDOT right-of-way and will be maintained as a part of this project.

5) Allow an alternative commercial pan driveway along Pinecrest Drive where the Uniform Standard Drawing (222.1) is required.



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Justification:

The project Engineer states that the standard is an existing condition and because of its location on a local street is an acceptable design for the street. Pinecrest is a short local street that serves a few properties. Additionally, the street ends in a cul-de-sac, therefore, maintaining the existing pan driveway will not impact the use the site or the street and is an acceptable design at this location because of minimal vehicular traffic on the Pinecrest Street.

6) Increase the height of a retaining wall along the east side of the easternmost drivethrough lane to 4.5 feet where a maximum height of three (3) is the standard.

Justification:

This waiver is necessary because of the existing grade adjacent to the eastern portion of the parcel. The retaining wall is located along the drive-through lane and will not impact the site, landscaping or street frontage. The height of the retaining wall is depicted on the grading plan and will not impact the landscaping or the street frontage. The required landscaping along the Pinecrest street frontage will screen and buffer the retaining wall.

Design Reviews:

1) Allow alternative locations for the main entrances of both restaurant buildings. 30.04.05

Justification:

Both restaurant buildings have entrances at the sides of building instead along the street frontages as required by Code. This request is necessary because brands are located in various states and have standard designs with entrances that do not face street frontages. The buildings, however, are placed close to the street frontages and have architectural features that enhance the portions/sides of the building that front the street.

2) For two restaurants with drive-throughs and an outdoor dining area.

Justification:

The proposed restaurant uses are community serving uses with customers drawn from the immediate area. This use is a redevelopment of a site and an infill project on a site which has an existing Bank building which will be demolished to accommodate the proposed restaurant. The restaurants fulfils the growth management requirements by developing on this site and maximizing the capacities of existing infrastructure and services.

The building primarily complies with Code requirements because they have four sided architectures and all sides of the buildings including along the street frontages are completed with architectural details depicted for each respective restaurant brand. Both building elevations

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depict horizontal articulations with variation in roof heights, building material, textures, and colors.
