Water System Update:

Staff repaired an 18" main break on Casino Dr. and returned the line to service in less than 24 hours. Staff responded to ten customer service calls in October.

Water Resources Development Act (WRDA): Authorization for \$29 million for BBWD improvements passed the House and Senate in late 2024. Staff continues to work with U.S. Army Corp Engineers on 219 Environmental Infrastructure program. A letter was submitted with intent to facilitate the design phase of one 2MG storage tank.

VI. Planning & Zoning:

1. PA-25-700043-LAUGHLIN LAGOON, LLC:

PLAN AMENDMENT to redesignate the existing land use category from Entertainment Mixed-Use (EM) to Ranch Estate Neighborhood (RN) on 7.63 acres. Generally located south of Casino Drive and east of Needles Highway within Laughlin. (For possible action)

2. ZC-25-0720-LAUGHLIN LAGOON, LLC:

ZONE CHANGE to reclassify 7.63 acres from a CR (Commercial Resort) Zone to an RS80 (Residential Single-Family 80) Zone. Generally located south of Casino Drive and east of Needles Highway within Laughlin (description on file). (For possible action)

There was a brief discussion with the main concern was retaining public access on the public roads to access the water.

Both items were voted on together.

Upon a voice vote, both items were approved per staff recommendations 4-0.

VII. General Business:

1. Consider a loan in concept from the Fort Mohave Development Fund to the Big Bend Water District for the construction of a water storage tank. (For possible action)

Guy Hobbs, the financial advisor for Clark County, provided a re-cap and additional information regarding a possible loan for the proposed water tank from Fort Mohave Development Funds. There was a lengthy discussion with the board and the residents.

The board rejected the item as written and requested to re-hear the item at the next LTAB meeting to be held December 9, 2025, with the requested wording to include in part:

Consider for approval the conceptual loan from the Fort Mohave Development Funds. (FMDF) to cap costs to build the water storage tanks 1 & 2, contingent on the following studies and designs. Design plans funded by FMDF and the loan to be reimbursed.

Completion of a Hydrology Study for the current tank and the addition of the new tank.

Reports and design plans are to be completed by an independent 3rd party.

Upon a voice vote the item was denied as written, to be re-heard at the December 9th, 2025, LTAB meeting with the requested word changes. 4-0
