Mr. Moskowitz reminded everyone that yesterday was the first day of school and encouraged everyone to be mindful of traffic safety and watch for students.

He highlighted the successful Commissioner Naft Back-to-School Health & Wellness Fair, held in partnership with Laughlin Schools. More than 250 people attended, with community partners and the

Athletics mascot, Stomper, participating in the event. The dental and vision vans provided free services to attendees. Individuals who received glasses through the vision services will receive follow-up information from Healthy Together regarding a return visit on Friday, September 11, from 2:00–4:00 p.m. at the school. Those unable to attend may have their glasses mailed to them or left at the school for pickup.

The Commissioner Naft Back-to-School Splash event was also a success, with approximately 270 attendees. Mr. Moskowitz thanked Metro and its volunteers for providing shaved ice and Tri-State Community Health Care for providing pizza. Commissioner Naft provided popcorn, and other activities were available. Due to the strong turnout, similar events are planned for next summer.

Mr. Moskowitz reminded residents to utilize the UMC Connection Center across from the Government Center for minor illnesses and injuries, particularly during the school year.

He also thanked the community for supporting the Fitness Room at the Spirit Mountain Activity Center, which has had more than 100 sign-ups and received positive feedback.

Water Treatment

July 2026 diversions: 319 acre-feet (103.9 MG) 2026 YTD total diversions: 2,013 acre-feet (655.9 MG)

Water System Update: Upgraded surge tank controls at the raw water and finished water pump stations.
Cleaned river intake screens.

Hydraulic analysis update: Ms. Ochs met with members of BBWD as well as Mark Moskowitz and Guy Hobbs. It was determined to send a proposal to an engineering firm to complete the study.

The FEIS (Final Environment Impact Statement) outlines a short-term plan to reduce allocation for lower basin states for NV, AZ, and CA for 2027-2028 as a suggested path from the Federal Government. Carrie Larson asked about the process and the ability to add public comments. Jason Bailey said he will look into the process and provide an update.

Ms. Ochs would like to get a copy of the Legislative Bill to see how funds can be used for the 1st or 2nd tank.
