



## "POP-UP" COVID-19 VACCINE CLINIC PLANNED AT ALLEGIANT STADIUM



Southern Nevadans will have the unique opportunity to get vaccinated in Allegiant Stadium at clinics scheduled for Thursday, June 10 - Sunday, June 13, and Thursday, June 17 - Sunday, June 20.

The clinic will offer the Pfizer and Janssen vaccines beginning at 2 p.m. each day. The last appointments will be available until 7:45 p.m. each day. Appointments for the vaccines at this site are encouraged and will be available beginning June 1 at [www.snhd.info/covid-vaccine](http://www.snhd.info/covid-vaccine). Walk-ins will be accommodated based on clinic capacity each day.

"We are hopeful that this rare opportunity to go inside Allegiant Stadium will motivate residents to get vaccinated," said Clark County Commissioner Michael Naft, whose district includes the stadium. "For anyone who has been waiting for the right time, this unique experience will be safe, convenient, and free."

# GET WATER SMART THIS SUMMER



With below average snowpack last winter, Lake Mead water levels are expected to decline 10 feet by the end of year and trigger a federally-declared shortage on the Colorado River, which will reduce available water supplies for Arizona and Southern Nevada. In total, Southern Nevada will need to rely on nearly 7 billion gallons less water -- enough to serve more than 40,000 Las Vegas Valley households for one year. Should Lake Mead's water level continue to decline, Southern Nevada will face additional reductions to our Colorado River allocation in the coming years.

Water conservation efforts over the past two decades have our community positioned well to manage these shortage conditions; however, our community's water use increased last year by more than 13 percent. With shortage conditions on the horizon, water conservation has never been more important. Follow the seasonal watering restrictions, replace grass with drip-irrigated landscaping, and prevent and report water waste to local water utilities. As a reminder, summer watering restrictions are in effect across the community. As temperatures warm, slowly ramp-up outdoor irrigation of grass areas by only adding additional watering days as needed. Maintaining a three- or four-day watering schedule and slowly adding additional watering days as the summer heat increases will help reduce water use, save on water bills, and keep landscapes healthy. ## SUMMER DAY CAMP 2021 AND CAMP 12

**WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW?**

- Day Camp is designed for participants ages 5-11 years and Camp 12+ is designed for participants ages 12-14 years
- Offered on Monday-Friday from 7:00am-6:00pm
- We do provide breakfast/lunch from Three Square, but Participants should bring an afternoon snack.
- Parents and participants are required to go through a daily intake process that includes temperatures checks and a health wellness check. Temperatures of 100.4 degrees or higher will not be admitted into the facility.

**WHAT DOES MY CHILD DO AT CAMP?**

- Daily activities will include educational time, games, arts n crafts, sports and theme activities. Participants will be placed in small groups and group leaders will promote social distancing throughout activities. Participants will be required to wear a face covering (masks) while in the facility.

**WHAT IS THE COST FOR SUMMER CAMP?**

- The price of camp is \$20 per day.
- We accept CCAP (Las Vegas Urban League). Parents must provide current certificate of benefits assigned to Paradise Recreation Center.
- There is a 50% discount for the third child when enrolling three or more siblings for the same week.
