The work for the above referenced project has been completed. Below is a summary of project related information.

The purpose of the above referenced project was:

The Clark County Desert Conservation Program manages regional Endangered Species Act compliance through administration of the Multiple Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP) and by implementing the conservation actions as described in the MSHCP. In accordance with the MSHCP, the County must acquire and restore riparian property along the Virgin River, Muddy River and Meadow Valley Wash in Clark County, Nevada. Conservation actions described in the MSHCP include measures that require construction services to support projects throughout southern Nevada. The County needed assistance with reviewing and development of restoration designs, conceptual plans, and revegetation plans for its properties.

The major accomplishments or findings of this project include:

The contractor (NCDE) performed reviews and analysis of Clark County properties along the Virgin and Muddy River areas. NCDE helped with budget assistance and reviewing planned projects adjacent to DCP properties. NCDE provided analysis and alternatives to the Muddy River Restoration Project on the DCP properties that would reduce the scale and cost. They provided feedback on potential erosion mitigation and restoration processes. NCDE reviewed available materials and provided comments to the potential effects of the BLM project for a levy relocation project that was proposed by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM).
