Do you need assistance with....?

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (**SNAP**) – Food Assistance Helps low-income individuals and families buy nutritious food from authorized retailers, formerly known as "Food Stamps".
TANF – Cash Assistance Provides temporary cash assistance and support services for needy families and relative caregivers to care for dependent children in their homes of in the homes.
Medicaid – Medical Assistance Helps meet the cost of medical services for individuals receiving public assistance payments, and individuals and families with low-income.

Assists low-income Nevadans with the cost of home energy.
Child Care Assistance Assists low-income families in obtaining child care to work. Resource and referral services are available to all Nevada families at no cost.

WHAT TO BRING:

1. For married filing jointly both spouses must be present.
2. Govt issued photo ID or driver's license for taxpayer and spouse (if married).
3. Social security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number documents for the taxpayer, spouse and/or dependents. Birth dates for taxpayer, spouse and/or dependents.
4. A copy of last year's tax return (if available). For prior year returns, copies of income transcripts from IRS
5. All forms W-2's and 1099's and information for other income.
6. Information for all deductions including charitable contributions/credits, childcare provider and their Tax ID number.
7. Forms 1095-A, B or C (Affordable Care Act statements).
8. For direct deposit of refund, proof of account and bank's routing number.
