SILVERADO RANCH COMMUNITY CENTER **RECIEVES DESIGN APPROVAL**



The Silverado Ranch Community Center received design approvals at the October Board of County Commissioners Meeting. The Silverado Ranch Community Center will be Clark County's newest community center. It will be located at Silverado Ranch Boulevard and Gilespie Street.

The 38,000 square-foot center will feature an amphitheater, indoor track, basketball court, and more. It will be Clark County's first recreation facility with an indoor track and full-sized demonstration kitchen for cooking classes and events.

"Amenities like this one are too few, especially in unincorporated Clark County and particularly in Enterprise. That is why we chose to utilize District A's bond-funded park dollars to bring this tremendous public facility to this Township," said Commissioner Naft.



"Clark County has some of the widest, longest, fastest roads out there, and we know speed kills at 45 mph, you're much more likely to be killed, more likely to be a fatality, and we have so many roads in our community that have that great speed," said Commissioner Naft.
