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


Commissioner Marilyn Kirkpatrick donated bikes to be raffled and given to the children. Later that day, a bike parade was held.

Held at the Fairgrounds in Logandale, Second Saturday is a showcase of local vendors in the community.






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### 9/11 MEMORIAL CELEBRATION

Following the ceremony, visit the rotunda exhibit exploring the community's grief and healing process since Oct. 1, 2017. The retrospective is called "5 Years Later: Remembering 1 October & Becoming Vegas Stronger" and features letters, posters, signs, and other items from the Clark County Museum's 22,000-piece 1 October collection. Also learn about the ongoing work to build a permanent memorial that remembers those who perished in the attack, honors survivors, first responders and all those affected by the incident, and celebrates the resiliency of our community. The rotunda also contains the Angels of Love exhibit, which features glass angels in remembrance of the lives lost and the hundreds of people wounded as well as memorabilia to honor law enforcement and agencies that responded to the attack.


Comfortable clothing and gym shoes are required. A pickleball paddle is recommended but not required for your first lesson. Balls will be supplied.



# **RECORDING NOTIFICATION SERVICE**


Residents may list up to five variations of their name and up to five parcel numbers per registered email address. This service will only notify the subscriber of recording events based on the enrolled name(s) or parcel number(s) following sign-up.



If you receive an alert, a document has been recorded that includes a name or parcel that you are monitoring. The alert will provide you with a document instrument number.



Flu season typically begins in October and the Southern Nevada Health District and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommend annual flu vaccine for people age 6 months and older. Once vaccinated, it takes about two weeks to develop protection from the vaccine. Flu can be a serious illness for people who are at higher risk for complications, such as young children, people with chronic medical conditions, and older adults. A flu shot is the best protection against flu and its complications. Vaccine will be available at pharmacies, clinics, and the Southern Nevada Health District.



For individuals 50 and over, there is a second booster shot available.

Additionally, adults in Clark County now have another COVID-19 vaccine available to them at Southern Nevada Health District clinics. Novavax, which has been used worldwide, is currently available at the Health District's COVID-19 clinic at 280 S.
