COVID-19 UPDATES

Vote by Mail for June Primary Election



In an effort to limit the spread of the Coronavirus, the June 9, 2020, Primary Election will be conducted entirely by mail in Clark County and throughout Nevada.

All Clark County active registered voters will receive a mail ballot packet from the County Election Department in the mail on or before **May 18, 2020**.

Win the U.S. Census

Since the kickoff of the 2020 U.S. Census on March 12, about 52% of households in Nevada have filled out their census. A link to the U.S. Census bureau's response map, which tracks participation rates by state in the U.S. Census is posted on the Southern Nevada Counts "Win the Census" campaign website at www.SouthernNevadaCounts.com.

The Census form can be filled out online over the U.S. Census Bureau's website at www.2020Census.gov or by phone or mail.

Census Bureau is operating toll-free language assistance lines in many languages including the three most common spoken in Southern Nevada: English (844) 330-2020; Spanish (844) 468-2020; and Tagalog (844) 478-2020. It's critical that we all complete the Census so that our community can get the funding and representation we deserve from D.C. Please complete the Census if you have not already and encourage others to do the same!


Swab collections will be taken through community partners and processed at UMC's Lab

Presently, UMC's lab can process 500 tests per day. That number is expected to increase to 1,500 tests per day on Apr. 25, and then reach 4,000 tests per day on May 1. By June 1, the lab is expected to be able to process 10,000 tests per day. Tests take about 24 hours to complete.

In addition, UMC's lab will launch and anti-body testing on **May 30**. The anti-body tests can show whether someone is currently infected, and whether they have been infected with COVID-19 in the past.



Online Domestic Violence Temporary Protective Order



The Nevada Eighth Judicial District Court has launched an online guided application for domestic violence temporary protective orders, which is available at the following link: nevada.tylerhost.net/SRL/SRL/Start? legalProcessKey=Domestic Violence Temporary Protective Order.

Upon completion, the applicant will be set for a telephonic hearing. Applicants have until 4 p.m. to submit their completed application for a same-day phone-in hearing; otherwise, they will be set for a hearing on the following morning.

For those without access to a computer, the Family Law Self-Help Center is also processing domestic violence temporary protective order (TPO) applications by phone on Monday through **Friday from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.** Those facing domestic violence can call **702-455-1500** to get a TPO facilitated by phone.
