2019 Great Nevada Shakeout



Clark County to Support Great Nevada Shakeout On Oct. 17th

Clark County is supporting the Great Nevada Shakeout on Thursday, Oct. 17, at 10:17 a.m. to raise awareness about earthquake safety and how to "Drop, Cover and Hold On!" if an earthquake strikes.

The Great Shakeout is a worldwide event that encourages schools, businesses and organizations to participate in the annual safety drill. At 10:17 a.m., participants will be asked to "Drop, Cover and Hold On" wherever they are at work or home as if a major earthquake were occurring at that moment, and stay in place for 60 seconds.

Nevada is the fourth most seismically active state after Alaska, California and Hawaii, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. To learn more about the Great Nevada Shakeout visit: https://www.shakeout.org/nevada/

A funny and educational earthquake preparedness TV PSA featuring HGTV stars Drew and Jonathan Scott is posted on Clark County's YouTube. The popular "Property Brothers" duo, who live in the Las Vegas Valley part time, teamed up with Clark County to create the :30 second spot to help educate Las Vegas residents about earthquake safety. Most earthquake-related injuries result from collapsing walls, flying glass or falling objects. The best protection during a quake is to get under heavy furniture such as a desk or table until the shaking stops, and to stay away from windows to avoid shattering glass.





Community Groups Encouraged to Apply for Block Grants Through Oct 11

The application period to build capital improvement projects with Community Development Block Grants is open through Oct. 11. Local agencies and organizations serving the poor and vulnerable populations in our community are encouraged to apply. A link to the CDBG program application is available on the County's Community Resources Management website page at:: http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/social-service/crm/Pages/ZoomGrants.aspx

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development provides block grants to state and local communities to benefit low and moderate income households and areas through the development of affordable housing, community facilities, economic development and other anti-poverty initiatives. Local non-profit organizations and government agencies serving eligible clientele and areas in the community are encouraged to submit proposals for capital improvement projects over the five-year period of July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2025.

The application period to build capital Based on recent CDBG formula grants, Clark County estimates that approximately \$28.4 million in funding for capital projects in the community will be available through the upcoming five-year plan. Eligible funding categories include, but are not limited to, facilities that serve the homeless, disabled. elderly, abused children, battered spouses, and low/moderate income neighborhoods.

Projects funded during the 2015-2019 grant period included the Boulder Highway Collaborative Service Campus, Nevada Partners Workforce Development Center, Catholic Charities Food Facilities Consolidation and Expansion, Help of Southern Nevada Shannon West Homeless Youth Center, and improvements at several facilities serving low to moderate income areas in Clark County.

Commissioner Gibson, UMC & Former NFL Great to Host Asthma Awareness Day Event

Commissioner Jim Gibson, UMC Children's Hospital, and the Jovante Woods Foundation are coming together to promote asthma awareness with a free fair from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 7, at Sunset Park at 2601 E. Sunset Road. The fair will be held in Sunset Park's Area F, which is off Eastern Avenue just north of the Dunes and the railroad tracks.

The Jovante Woods Family Asthma Awareness Day fair is free to attend and will feature music, food vendors, face painting and other activities including free asthma screenings, pulmonary function tests and asthma education. Former NFL great lokey Woods will also be in attendance and available for pictures and autographs. The foundation is named for Woods' son, who died from complications due to asthma in 2010. "As a parent, there is nothing worse than losing a child," Woods said. "I don't want any parent to go through what I did so it's my duty and my calling to fight asthma and do what I can to make sure we put an end to this deadly disease."

"I am happy to help host the Jovante Woods Family Asthma Awareness Day, along with the Jovante Woods Foundation and UMC," Commissioner Gibson said. "I commend Ickey Woods and his family for dedicating their lives to educating families about this deadly disease and thank Ickey for bringing this event to Clark County and contributing proceeds from the event to UMC Children's Hospital."

Ickey Woods was a running back for the Cincinnati Bengals and before that a fullback for the UNLV football team. He is best remembered for his "Ickey Shuffle" end zone dance, performed each time he scored a touchdown. After Jovante Woods' death, Ickey Woods and his wife Chandra devoted their lives to fighting and bringing awareness to the signs and effects of asthma.

In addition to the fair, the Ickey Woods Celebrity Golf Tournament is scheduled to take place on Sept. 8, at the Bali Hai Golf Club. The star-studded tournament will also benefit the Jovante Woods Foundation and UMC Children's Hospital. Clark County Offering Free Lunchtime Emergency Preparedness Seminars in September

September is National Preparedness Month, and Clark County officials are reminding residents about resources available to help them prepare for emergencies of all types.

The top hazards identified by emergency managers in Southern Nevada are communicable disease, wildfire, flooding, earthquake and extreme heat. Power outages also can happen sporadically.

From Sept. 4 to Sept. 24, free emergency preparedness handouts, booklets and other materials will be available at an informational exhibit set up in the rotunda on the first floor of the Clark County Government Center, 500 S. Grand Central Pkwy., in downtown Las Vegas. Clark County's Office of Emergency Management also is hosting free lunchtime preparedness seminars for employees and the public every Wednesday in September from 12 p.m. to 1 p.m. The first one on Sept. 4, will be held in the ODC1 conference room near the cafeteria in the Government Center. The seminars on Sept. 11, 18 and 25 will be held in the Pueblo Room. Emergency Management staff also are available to talk to community groups about preparedness throughout the year. For requests, contact the office at (702) 455–5710.

Residents are encouraged to download the free Southern Nevada Community Preparedness App on their smartphones to receive weather alerts, safety tips snd other useful information. The app can be downloaded from the Office of Emergency Management's website pages: https://tinyurl.com/y3w86lx3. The app also allows users to

develop a personalized emergency plan that includes building a kit tailored to your needs and creating a contact list to help you reconnect with loved ones in the event of an emergency. Residents also can sign up to receive free texts and email alerts through the multi-agency Southern Nevada

On the Alert website at https://sonevada.onthealert.com/Terms/Index/?ReturnUrl=%2f.

Officials say the key steps for emergency preparedness are as follows:

- 1. Get a disaster supply kit. The kit should contain items for you and your family's basic needs for three days to ten days, including food and water, and provisions for infants, medically fragile family members and pets. First build a "go bag" for your car, then work on putting together at least a three-day supply kit, followed by a larger kit. An emergency supply kit for pets should include a leash, carrier, medicines and copies of current vaccination records in case you have to check your pet into a local shelter.
- 2. Create an emergency plan. Choose a primary and secondary meeting place in case an emergency affects your home or neighborhood, and designate an out-of-state contact for family members to call in case you are separated.
- 5. Be informed. In an emergency, stay tuned to local TV or radio stations for alerts, instructions, and official notifications. Participate in citizen training opportunities. Volunteer with the Southern Nevada chapter of the American Red Cross and other organizations that perform community assistance during emergencies.

Clark County Museum Scheduling Field Trip Requests for New School Year

Teachers in search of a unique and interesting educational field trip this school year need to look no further than the Clark County Museum located at 1830 S. Boulder Highway.

The museum is booking school groups for guided field trips Tuesday through Friday each week. Tours typically begin at 10 a.m. and end at noon, though other times can be requested and possibly arranged depending on the availability of staff.

During the two-hour guided school group tours, volunteers and staff guides will immerse students in Southern Nevada's history. The museum's Anna Roberts Parks Exhibit Center features displays chronicling Southern Nevada history from prehistoric times to Las Vegas's standing today as an entertainment mecca.

A walk along Heritage Street at the museum takes students back in time as they enter one of the only remaining pioneer homes in Southern Nevada, the historic Boulder City Train Depot, a replica print shop, a ghost town, jailhouse and other unique buildings.



Admissions rate for school tours is 50 cents per student, teacher, and adult leader. If you book your field trip for September 2019 or January and February 2020, you can receive free admission for one class per grade level thanks to donations provided by the Clark County Museum Guild. Regular admission price is \$1 for children and seniors and \$2 for adults.

County to Host Last, Largest Surplus Auction of Year on Nov. 23

Clark County will host the last and largest government surplus auction of 2018 at 8 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 23 at 4320 Stephanie St., off Flamingo Road near Dog Fancier's Park.

The popular auctions feature items used or acquired by area police and government agencies including cars, trucks, computers, office equipment, electronics and other lost and found items from McCarran International Airport. Clark County contracts with TNT Auction to manage the sales. Catalogs listing vehicles and miscellaneous items being sold are posted on TNT's website at www.tntauction.com and get updated regularly as the date of the sale approaches.

A three-day, preview and pre-registration period will be Wednesday, Nov. 20, through Friday, Nov. 22, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Anyone planning to participate in the live auction to bid on vehicles or miscellaneous items must register as a bidder on site at the TNT Auction trailer set up on the auction grounds. To become a registered bidder, participants need to present a valid ID. There is no cost to register.

Upon winning a bid on auction day, payment is due in the form of cash, cashier's checks, credit cards, debit cards, traveler's checks or money orders. YouTube videos in English and Spanish are posted on the County's



website at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov to walk interested participants through the process. Miscellaneous items are sold during a live, separate auction that is conducted at the same time as the vehicle auction.

An exception for on-site registration is if you plan to participate in the online portion of the vehicle auction, which is conducted at the same time as the on-site vehicle auction. Anyone who plans to bid for vehicles online must register in advance of the sale online through TNT's website. If you register online for the vehicle auction, you must bid online. In 2018 the auctions raised \$6.9 million for participating governmental entities, including \$4.4 million for Clark County agencies. Each auction drew an average of 1,927 bidders.
