Logandale Trails, just west of Moapa Valley, has been busy lately! On January 16th, the Las Vegas based Calico Racing sponsored the first ever marathon in Logandale Trails. The 200 runners ran through the area which is primarily recognized as a trails system for ATVs, jeeps, etc. Their route included the informal and primitive camping area of Logan Wash and then depending on the length of the event, paths diverged along other trails, but all runners had to come back up the 'big hill' to complete the event.

Volunteers from the Moapa Valley Rotary Club have been busy in the trails system too, especially in preparation for the marathon race. "We wanted the usual folks who come to ride the trails system to know that there would be runners out here this weekend." stated Denise Anderson. Rotarian Coordinator. "So we went around to the campers and trail riders informing them of the upcoming event. Everyone seemed very happy to see others enjoying the trails system." Elise McAllister, Administrator for Partners In Conservation (PIC) who has an Assistance Agreement with the BLM to manage and administer Logandale Trails said, "The Moapa Valley Rotary Club are super involved with all things in our community. They are so peoplefriendly, we asked them to be our Ambassadors for Logandale Trails. They routinely drive through the trails system, visiting with folks, handing out local goodie bags to highlight our local businesses that include maps, water, trash bags, and special
