The rear boxes of the trucks were built in 1994 and were of such good quality that they were able to be refurbished and remounted on the new Ford F550, 4WD chassis. creative re-use of resources saved the County over \$250,000 while still providing new vehicles to the hard working men and women of the Volunteer Fire Departments.

Three ranches formed the core of the Las Vegas community in the 1870's, and Spring Mountain Ranch was one of them! On September 15th, 2018, from 11:00AM - 2:00PM, Spring Mountain Ranch State Park turns back the clock to its early days as a pioneer ranch. Come experience the sights, smells, and tastes of the Nevada frontier branding, fresh squeezed lemonade, spinning, quilting, weaving, the Old Time Nevada Fiddlers, a bluegrass band, an appearance from Jackson the Burro and Carson the Mustang, and costumed interpreters ready to bring the past to life. There will be games, arts and crafts for all ages, including homemade whirly-gigs, rag doll making, potato sack races, and hobby horse races. Discover what school was like for pioneer children and learn how to square dance as volunteers demonstrate how it was done almost two hundred years ago. Plan to participate in the silent auction to benefit the volunteer and docent organization that supports the ranch with sharing all aspects of the history, including events like this.



At first glance, Las Vegas may not seem a logical choice as the site of the Federal Duck Stamp Art Contest. However, did you know that:

- Federal, state, city, and non-government partners work together to provide millions of acres of public access to outdoor recreation opportunities in the southern Great Basin.
- Desert National Wildlife Refuge is the largest refuge outside of Alaska.
- Pahranagat National Wildlife Refuge is a critical Pacific Flyway stopover; more than 73 percent of the refuge was created using monies from the Migratory Bird Conservation Fund to which Federal Duck Stamps have contributed over \$1 billion dollars.
- Tule duck decoys, which are made from tule rushes and feathers and resemble canvasbacks, are the oldest known examples of waterfowl decoys. A cache found in Nevada, created 2,000 years ago by Native Americans, point to a rich history of wildlife and a waterfowl hunting tradition in the area.

THE SIX-WEEK CURE:

DIVORCE RANCHES IN NEVADA

In a bold move to counter the effects of the Great Depression, Nevada legalized gambling and reduced the residency requirement to obtain a divorce to six weeks in 1931, From then on, divorce-seekers from all over the United States, mostly women, thronged to Nevada to obtain a divorce, Many of those who came required a level of privacy and seclusion not possible at urban hotels and motels, Meanwhile, local ranches outside of town began accepting paying guests to help make ends meet during the Depression, This combination of factors gave rise to the guest ranch, often referred to as a "dude ranch," or, sometimes, "divorce ranch."

Courtney Mooney is the senior historic preservation planner and architectural historian for North Wind Resource Consulting. Prior to this, Ms. Mooney was the city of Las Vegas historic preservation officer for 14 years. Ms. Mooney's interest in divorce ranches began while researching the history of Floyd Lamb Park at Tule Springs in Las Vegas. Thus far, most of the available research has focused on divorce ranches in and around Reno. Nevada as the once "divorce capital of the world." Ms. Mooney hopes to shift the balance by tracking down as much information as possible on the southern Nevada divorce ranches and write a reference book for researchers.
