As part of the changes to Title 10, effective August 4, 2025, each dog or cat over the age of four months of age must be implanted with microchip identification in accordance with CCC 10.08.070(b). Clark County Animal Protection Services has committed \$150,000.00 to bolster pet reunion efforts. To kickstart the program, the county has procured 10,000 microchips and has partnered with Hearts Alive Village, Heaven Can Wait, and the NSPCA to provide microchips for \$5.00 to unincorporated Clark County residents.
