If you do not have access to a computer or internet service at home, and you are participating in a government-based assistance program, you may qualify for a free or low-cost computer and low-cost internet service.

There are many local libraries and nonprofits that provide free access to computers with high-speed internet access. Some libraries even offer tablets that you can borrow for a week. Several local libraries and nonprofits even offer digital skills training programs.

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LOCAL LIBRARIES

Clark County has many libraries located in and around your neighborhood where you can get help with the following:

- ⌘ Reserve a computer for use at any of the local libraries
- ⌘ Check out an iPad or Chromebook for a week at a time
- ⌘ Check out a mobile Wi-Fi hotspot to get free internet access at home
- ⌘ Print, scan, copy or fax documents
- ⌘ Enroll in digital skills training classes
- ⌘ Get help with job searches through workforce programs
