Who Should Attend?

Drivers of vehicles between model years 1968 – 2010 that failed an emissions test.

What Should People Bring to the Event?

- Valid driver's license.
- Failed emissions test or vehicle inspection report (VIR).
- Vehicle registration or title.

What to Expect at the Event

Representatives from the Smog Free Clark County and the County's Division of Air Quality will be on hand to discuss the program and answer questions. Spanish speaking representatives will also be in attendance. For more about the program, go to SmogFreeClarkCounty.com.
