MAP counselors help investigate Medicare errors, waste, and abuse, and works with Medicare beneficiaries to prevent them from being victims of fraud. They also provide information, counseling, and assistance regarding Medicare programs, assisting with enrollment. All assistance is provided for free by trained, unbiased counselors.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waiver for the Frail Elderly (FE)

The HCBS FE Waiver provides community-based, in-home services to enable the frail and elderly to remain in their own homes and avoid placement in a long-term care facility. Waiver Case Managers assist recipients with accessing services through the HCBS Waiver(s) and through Nevada Medicaid FFS options including but not limited to Personal Emergency Response (PERS), Homemaker, Chore, Respite, Adult Companion, Adult Day Care, Group Home/Assisted Living, Personal Care Services, etc.

HCBS Waiver for Persons with Physical Disabilities (PD)

The HCBS PD Waiver provides community-based, in-home services to enable persons with a primary diagnosis of a physical disability to remain in their own homes and avoid placement in a long-term care facility. Waiver Case Managers assist recipients with accessing services through the HCBS Waiver(s) and through Nevada Medicaid FFS options including but not limited to PERS, Chore, Respite, Environmental Adaptations, Specialized Medical Equipment, Home Delivered Meals, Attendant Care, Assisted Living, Personal Care Services, etc.

Community Service Options Program for the Elderly (COPE) Provides non-medical services to persons age 65 or older who are at risk of nursing home placement - Personal Care - Social Adult Day Care - Adult Companionship - Chore Service - Personal Emergency Response System - Homemaker - Case management – Respite Care for primary caregiver.

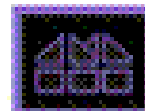

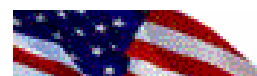
