Median Family Income for a family of four in FY 2025 in Clark County is \$94,900.

A <u>low-income household</u> means a household having an income equal to or less than the CDBG low income limit established by HUD. A <u>very-low-income household</u> means a household having an income equal to or less than the CDBG very low-income limit established by HUD at 50 percent of median household income. An <u>extremely low-income household</u> means a household whose income is 30 percent or less of the Median Family Income adjusted for family size.

<u>Presumed Benefit Categories</u>: Activities that exclusively serve a group of persons in any one or a combination of the following HUD approved categories may be presumed to benefit 51% of the persons who are low to moderate income. Since these groups are presumed to be low and moderate income, individual income verification is not required although other client statistics will be required. HUD Presumed Benefit groups include abused children, battered spouses/partners, elderly persons (62 or older), adults meeting the Bureau of the Census' Current Population Reports definition of severely disabled, homeless persons, illiterate adults, persons living with AIDS, and migrant farm workers.
