



KEEP CLARK COUNTY CLEAN TIPS

- **Donate & Recycle.** Donate salvageable items to a non-profit organization in our community. Reuse cardboard boxes, plastic bags and paper sacks. Use cloth napkins instead of paper and washable containers instead of plastic wrap.
- **Report Illegal Dumping.** Call the Health District at (702) 759-0600 or go online to file a complaint at www.southernnevadahealthdistrict.org. If the dumping site is within unincorporated Clark County, report it to our Public Response Office at (702) 455-4191 or file a complaint online via **ClarkConnect**: <https://clarkconnect.clarkcountynv.gov/>.
- **Don't Be a Pain in the Drain!** Never pour fat, oil, grease or grit down the sink, and don't flush prescriptions or over-the-counter medications down the toilet or sink. Wipes go in the trash, not down the toilet. Learn more via the County Water Reclamation District at www.paininthedrain.com.
- **Report Plugged Inlets.** Report plugged inlets and storm drains on streets in unincorporated Clark County to our Department of Public Works at (702) 455-6000 or online via **ClarkConnect** at www.ClarkCountyNV.gov. Reports also can be made to the Regional Flood Control District at www.regionalflood.org or (702) 685-0000 for referral to appropriate local jurisdictions.
- **Dispose of Household Waste Properly.** Take paints, cleaners and other household waste to a hazardous waste collection site for proper disposal: www.republicservices.com. Buy batteries, anti-freeze and motor oil from stores that recycle these items.
- **Check Your Car for Leaks:** Keep your car maintained to avoid leaks of harmful fluids into our storm drains. Use a drip pan when changing your oil; clean up spills with absorbent materials like kitty litter and throw it away in a trash can.
- **Volunteer for a Community Cleanup.** Visit Get Outdoors Nevada's website at www.getoutdoorsnevada.org/event-listing for a list of upcoming events.
- **Don't Be a Litter Bug!** Carry a litter bag in your car or keep litter in your pocket until you can find a trash can. Plant flowers or trees or other desert-friendly vegetation in your yard. People litter less in beautified neighborhoods.
- **Pick Up One Piece of Litter a Day.** That means 365 fewer pieces of trash on our streets, in our parks and near our schools thanks to you!
- **Put a Lid On It.** Make sure your trash bins have securely-attached lids. One gust of wind can make a big mess.
- **Pick Up After Your Pets.** Pet waste left on lawns or parks gets washed into storm drains.
- **Contractor Cleanliness.** Cover your truck loads whenever you transport landscaping or construction materials. Place trash containers on work sites for workers to use.
