These Notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by Clark County.

**REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about **April 22, 2026**, Clark County will submit a request to the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development, Region 9 (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant (CDGB-CV) funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, 24 CFR Part 570, as amended, to undertake an project known as Boulder City Emergency Center. Upgrades would include additional dedicated phone lines, the purchase of dedicated laptops for Emergency Operations Center (EOC) members, SMART Boards (an interactive, touch-sensitive whiteboard that functions as a large display, allowing users to control computer applications, write in digital ink, and collaborate in real-time), and new audiovisual equipment. Additionally, a metal warehouse-style building will be added next to the EOC to centralize the pandemic logistics storage. The improvement project is at 1101 Elm Street, Boulder City, Nevada 89005, on Clark County Assessor's Parcel Numbers (APNs) 186-08-601-007 and 186-08-401-012.

**FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

Clark County has determined the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 is not required. All comments received through **Tuesday, April 21, 2026**, will be considered by Clark County prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

## ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

Clark County certifies to HUD that Karen Michelin in her capacity as Manager of Neighborhood Services Certifying Environmental Officer consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the County to use Program funds.

## OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and Clark County's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of Clark County; (b) Clark County has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR, Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in writing in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development, HUD San Francisco Regional Office, One Sansome Street, Suite 1200, San Francisco, CA 94104. Potential objectors should contact the San Francisco Regional Office to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
